## BOARD OF DIRECTORS REPORT

In the course of 2015, the Board of directors held nine meetings in the context of the 2014-2017 strategic plan's second year of implementation. As is the case every year, the Board adopted its activity and committee plans. It also approved budgetary forecasts, the annual financial statements of the FGM and the Investment Fund, and the awarding of grants. A review of internal regulations and director profiles was also conducted. The Board ensured the continuation of the investment policy implementation, the development of communications projects, and a review of staff working conditions. A harassment policy and codes of ethic for FGM employees and volunteers as well as a gift acceptance policy were some of the new elements of governance adopted by the Board. In addition, the Board paid particular attention to the regulatory compliance of its Investment Fund and to its operations as a whole. Finally, the Board of directors approved the seventh edition of Vital Signs along with FGM's participation in the Collective Impact Project launched by Centraide.

I thank all the members of the Board for a year of great achievements. I especially wish to convey my most sincere gratitude to the directors who are leaving us: **Monette Malewski**, whose assistance over the past six years has been exceptional; **Monique Jérôme-Forget** who made her vast experience available to us and **Karim Salabi**, who despite a short mandate was very much involved in the Foundation. Lastly, I should point out that I shall be stepping down at the conclusion of a six-year term, which I have carried out with great pride.

## A WORD FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CEO

### A VITAL COMMITMENT

In 2015, the Foundation of Greater Montréal enjoyed unprecedented prominence. The release of the *2015 Greater Montréal Vital Signs* report lay at the heart of what was an eventful year. That exhaustive portrait of social reality brought to light – at the conclusion of eight months of work, meetings with experts, and statistical research – a city “in transition.” The report, published at the same time as those of 25 other community foundations across Canada, generated significant media coverage and gave rise to a series of public discussions on the progress of Greater Montréal and its challenges. Carried out under the theme “It’s time to talk about it,” this operation had an accelerating effect within both the community and our foundation. We also stepped up our efforts with regard to a number of Greater Montréal “vital” issues, these being homelessness, domestic violence, remaining in school, mental health, the environment, poverty and community art.

The year 2015 was one of important changes in philanthropic and community-based circles. The situation not only gave rise to important discussions, but also brought about a number of transformations and the birth of innovative projects. Inspiring new partnerships were established, and donors were mobilized through campaigns focusing on homelessness and on refugees. The Collective Impact Project (CIP), an anti-poverty initiative launched by Centraide, is an eloquent example of this new dynamic. In addition to the FGM, five other foundations contributed to the CIP, which generated a total investment of over \$17 million. New alliances are also taking shape in a number of other sectors.



To maximize the impact of philanthropy in the community, the Foundation of Greater Montréal organized communication events, and was very much a presence on social media, the better to get the word out. The FGM Philanthropy Day last November attracted more than 300 people. The Foundation also introduced a new user-friendly access system for fund management through which donors can directly consult their statements of activity online and take full advantage of our collective infrastructure. The Foundation will henceforth rely on a network of experts in all branches of its mission to more effectively advise our donors. Overall, the Foundation of Greater Montréal is now in a position to respond more efficiently to the varying needs of donors and of the different organizations targeted by these initiatives.

All of this, we must not forget, is possible thanks to the contribution of the patrons, the organizations and the businesses that embarked on an involvement in the philanthropic community and organized extremely dynamic mobilization campaigns. Close to 50 new funds were thus created at the FGM in the course of the past year.

Looking back on this exceptional year, the Foundation of Greater Montréal team wishes to express its deepest thanks to Mr. Richard W. Pound, who will be saying farewell to us after six years of chairing the Board of directors. Because of the recognition he enjoys, his integrity and his efforts, Mr. Pound was able to broaden the bases of our foundation and was an ardent promoter of philanthropy. A heartfelt thank you.

## GROWTH OF THE FGM INVESTMENT FUND

The Foundation of Greater Montréal Investment Fund (FGMIF) continued its growth by posting an increase of **\$7,813,903** over the course of 2015. This growth of **4.4%** lifted the total value of assets under its management to **\$185,307,402** as at December 31, 2015.

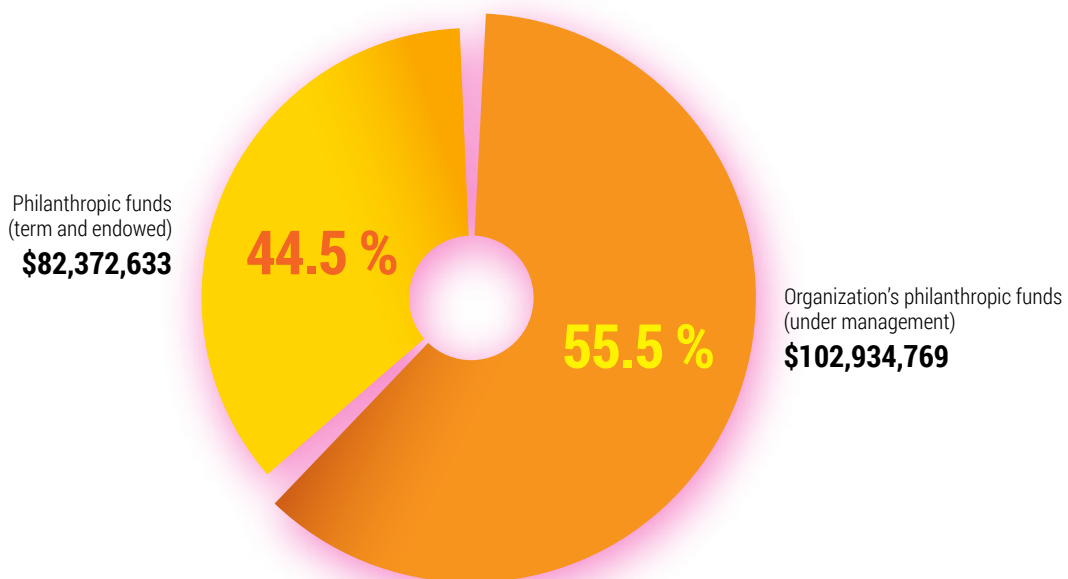

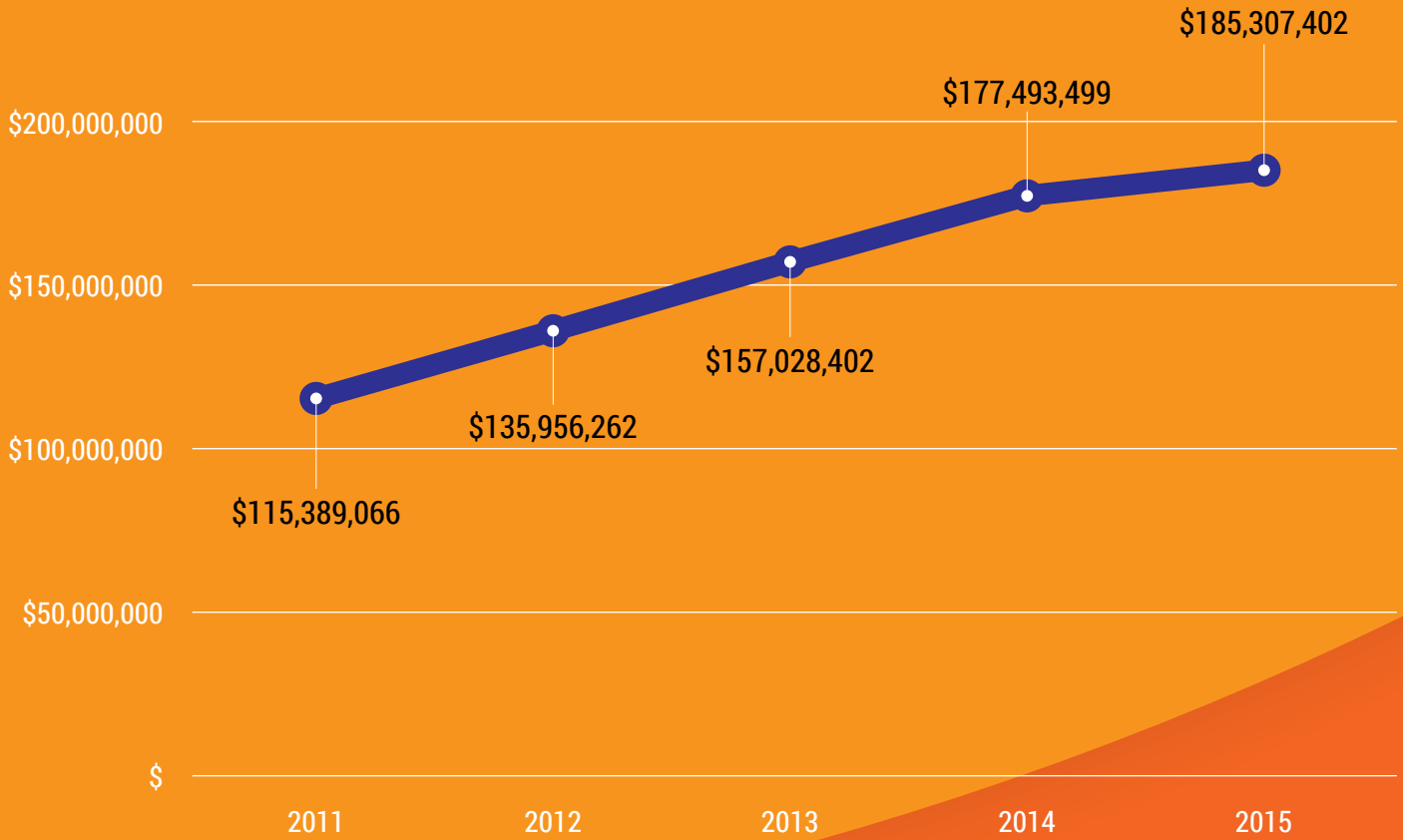

## INVESTMENT COMMITTEE REPORT



In November 2014, the Board of directors approved a new investment policy. In the course of 2015 the implementation of this new investment policy required considerable energy in the selection of managers for the different asset classes.

In early 2015 the FGM invested about 5% of its portfolio in a socially-responsible-investment fund.

Assets of the Foundation of Greater Montréal Investment Fund reached \$185.3 million in 2015, denoting an increase of \$7.8 million compared to the previous year. This increase is the result of net investment revenues of \$6.3 million, net inflows of \$2.3 million (inflows of \$11 million and withdrawals of \$8.7 million) and a change in unrealized investment appreciation of -\$0.8 million.

Average FGM performance for the last four years was at 8.7%, while the 2015 performance stood at 3.1%. Over the past four years the FGMIF exceeded its objective of adding 3% to the consumer price index (CPI) (8.7% vs. 4.3%). In these times of market turmoil, it is difficult to predict short- and medium-term performance.

I thank all the members who took a very active part in the work of our committee, which held 21 meetings in 2014, the new investment policy necessitating numerous meetings with investment managers. During 2015, FGMIF assets were entrusted to five investment specialists, with portfolio and portfolio-manager performance monitored by the Mercer company.

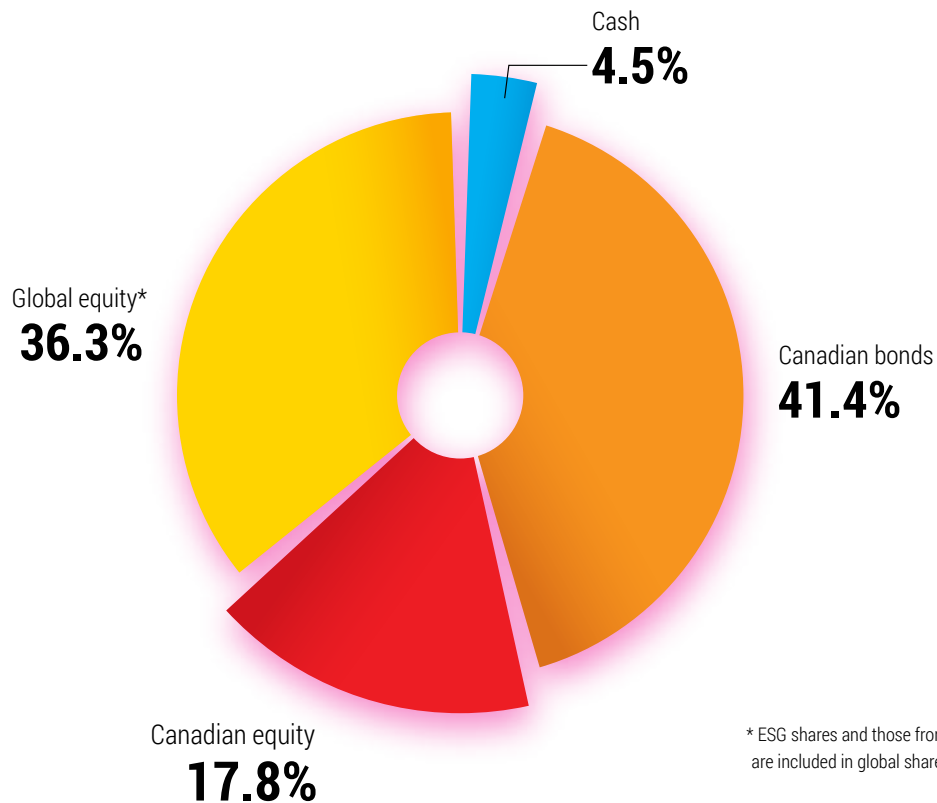

### THE ROLE OF THE FGMIF

The FGM Investment Fund (FGMIF) was created in 2004. Its objective is to generate greater revenue by pooling assets. The FGMIF's orientations are guided by the foundation's investment policy, and its legal framework is subject to the Autorité des marchés financiers (AMF). The rules of the AMF provide guidelines for the obligations of the investment fund manager while taking into account the fund's specificities, such as the obligation of accountability to fund holders (financial statements, portfolio performance, and so on). Governance of the FGMIF is subject to the rules and supervision of the FGM Board of Directors and its Investment Committee.

### DIRECT ACCESS TO FUND STATEMENTS VIA THE WEB

In 2015, the FGM unveiled a new web application that allows fund creators to have direct online access to all the pertinent information on their philanthropic project. This secure portal, which is reached through the Access Funds icon on the [fgmtl.org](http://fgmtl.org) home page, lets them monitor their funds by viewing digital statements any time they wish. In addition to being resolutely practical, this access to online statements has reduced our environmental footprint by reducing our consumption of paper.

The FGM offers donors many different ways to create their own philanthropic fund. The FGM supports each donor throughout the process of creating a charitable fund whose revenues are distributed annually based on the objectives established by the donor. The FGM also builds strong bonds with non-profit organizations and private foundations that entrust it with the management of their funds.

## PARTNERSHIP WITH MÉCÉNAT PLACEMENTS CULTURE

This matching donation program by the Québec government enhances the donations collected by cultural organizations and communications agencies as part of their fundraising campaigns. The program encourages these organizations to diversify their funding sources, and helps them to strengthen their autonomy and financial security via medium or long-term investments using the revenues they collect. To benefit from this program, eligible organizations must create a fund within a community foundation partner. An excellent example is the *Mécénat Musica* campaign—thanks to the remarkable initiative of its donors, this campaign added assets of over two million dollars to the endowment fund of 13 musical organizations in the Montréal area.

## PARTNERSHIP WITH CANADIAN HERITAGE

By means of the Canada Cultural Investment Fund (specifically, the Endowment Incentives component), the Department of Canadian Heritage encourages private donors to contribute to endowment funds for not-for-profit professional arts organizations, so they can access new sources of funding in the future. Raising capital and creating endowments give these organizations greater capacity for realizing artistic expression by supporting their long-term stability. For the private sector, this represents a chance to get actively involved in the cultural affairs of the community through a well-proven funding mechanism. Canadian Heritage agrees to match donations by making a grant corresponding to a percentage of the sums raised by the fund, up to 100 percent.

## PARTNERSHIP WITH PLACEMENTS SPORTS

Created in 2012, Placements Sports is a matching donation program for sport federations in Québec. The program is financed by the Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport and administered by SPORTS QUÉBEC, a corporation whose mission is to promote and defend the interests of the sports community.

Placements Sports helps sports federations by enhancing the donations they receive through their fundraising campaigns. The sums transferred to the federations vary based on the volume of requests made under the program. By encouraging individuals, corporations and foundations to donate to Québec sports federations, the program helps them to promote the development of their respective sports and to better serve the public. The backing of Placements Sports brings significant advantages to these federations, starting with increased revenues and the creation of profitable long-term investments.

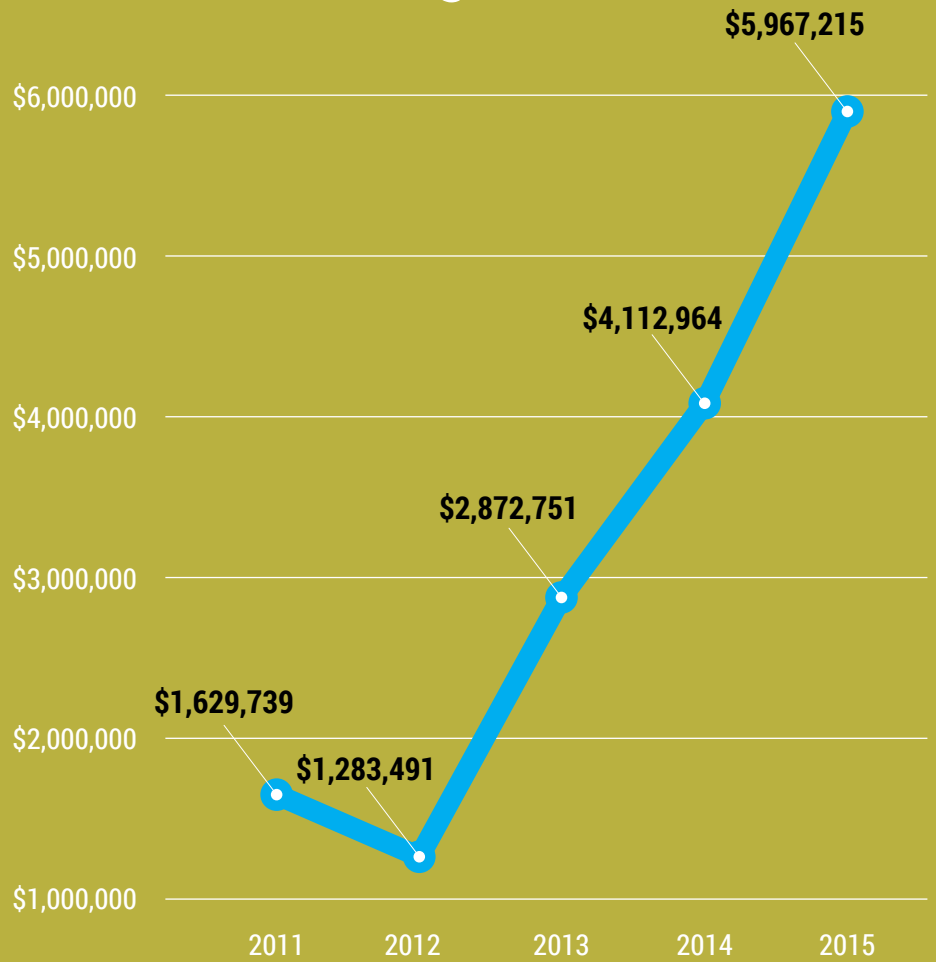

## PROGRAM AND GRANTS COMMITTEE REPORT

In its 12<sup>th</sup> year of existence, the Programs and Grants Committee forged ahead and selected new projects and initiatives under the Community Grants Program that will strengthen communities in Greater Montréal. The committee identified the following priority areas: student retention, mental health and homelessness, local green initiatives, community art, domestic violence and inclusiveness. It chose 55 projects from the 280 submissions. Fourteen of these projects received a grant under *Levier Grand Montréal*, the new Greater Montréal key project component that promotes innovative and strategic initiatives in sustainable development for the metropolitan area.

In 2015, the FGM provided a total financial support of \$731,500 to community organizations in Greater Montréal.

The FGM wishes to thank the members of the 2015 Programs and Grants Committee for the rigour they demonstrated in the selection process. The dedication and expertise of these representatives from the various sectors ensured that grants were distributed in a fair and pertinent fashion.

# GREATER MONTRÉAL'S VITAL SIGNS: A UNIFYING VIEW

As with more than 25 community foundations that are active in other Canadian cities, the Foundation of Greater Montréal regularly conducts a complete health checkup of its metropolitan area, in the form of its *Vital Signs* report. This comprehensive study evaluates the overall vitality of Greater Montréal, not only with economic data, but also with a qualitative approach that lets us draw a comparative picture of how the region's social and community situation is evolving.

The 7<sup>th</sup> edition of *Greater Montréal's Vital Signs* revealed a portrait that is encouraging in many respects. The Montréal region stands out favourably for the quality of its living environment, for its flourishing cultural sector, for its strong knowledge economy linked to the presence of many universities, and for its safe environment. However certain social issues remain of concern, including poverty, air quality, domestic violence and homelessness.

*Greater Montréal's Vital Signs* also serves as a rallying call for the whole community to commit itself to the well-being of all its citizens. Following the unveiling of the report, more than five discussion panels were held in Greater Montréal on the topics of homelessness, school retention, domestic violence, the environment, and sustainable mobility.

## THE FGM'S SIGNIFICANT ACTIONS IN THE COMMUNITY

### Partnership

A new partnership was established in 2015: the Collective Impact Project (CIP), developed from a Centraide initiative. The CIP was set up by a team of partners that includes the FGM and five other private foundations. Its objective is to support communities in their efforts to break the cycle of poverty in 15 different Montréal neighbourhoods. The foundations have pledged \$17 million to Centraide over five years for implementing this ambitious initiative into action.

## PROJECT HIGHLIGHTS

### Homelessness

Following a street count (I Count MTL) of homeless Montrealers in March 2015, the FGM helped to fund a five-year plan for reducing chronic and cyclical homelessness in the city. The plan is led by the Montréal Movement to End Homelessness (MMEH).

### JE PASSE PARTOUT INSPIRES YOUNG READERS

Under its intergenerational project known as FantasTIC, the community organization *Je Passe Partout* promotes the pleasure of reading among students aged six to ten who are from disadvantaged backgrounds and are at risk of failing at school. The results are very encouraging—the majority of these students are already showing a stronger interest in reading.

### MOBILE LEGAL CLINIC (MLC)

Mobile Legal Clinic's mission is to promote access to justice for the homeless, the impoverished and/or the marginalized members of our society. Since February 2015, the MLC student-advisors have invested more than 3000 hours as volunteers to help 450 people who are homeless or destitute and need assistance to deal with a variety of legal issues.



### CARREFOUR DE RESSOURCES EN INTERCULTUREL (CRIC)

The *Femmes-relais interculturels* project offers multilingual support to newly arrived families, and guides them to the resources they need. Among its various results, the contribution by the FGM allowed CRIC to take part in a program to welcome new Syrian refugees in Montréal.

### LA SOCIÉTÉ POUR LES ARTS EN MILIEUX DE SANTÉ (SAMS)

Looking ahead to celebrations for Montréal's 375<sup>th</sup> anniversary, this organization is reaching out to seniors living in Montréal elder care residences, and recording their memories of life in the city for a project entitled *Cueilleurs de mémoires*. The composer Kiya Tabassian will collaborate with soprano Suzie LeBlanc and accordionist Steve Normandin to create a musical composition that is inspired by those memories. Their work will be released in 2017.

## GOVERNANCE, ETHICS AND NOMINATIONS COMMITTEE REPORT

Made up exclusively of members of the FGM Board of directors, the Governance Committee met a total of seven times in 2015. The committee recommended an harassment policy and a code of ethics for employees to the Board. It also reviewed the Foundation by-laws and internal regulations.

The committee developed competency profiles for Board members and submitted a proposal aimed at ensuring a fairer balance between the number of women and the number of men. The committee also clarified the status of honorary members.

As also discussed, a succession plan for members of the Board as well as a policy to improve welcoming and training new Board members.

## AUDIT COMMITTEE REPORT



The committee is now composed of a minimum of five people, four of whom were appointed by the Board of directors, and one member from outside the organization. The committee's mandate is to oversee the financial administration of the Foundation with respect to budget, operating systems and accounting, and to examine the auditor's report and the audited financial statements for both the Foundation of Greater Montréal and the Foundation of Greater Montréal Investment Fund (FGMIF). The committee must submit all these reports to the Board for approval. The committee also presented the Board with its

recommendations, concerning the appointment of auditors and their remuneration, in addition to overseeing the general audit program for the FGM and the FGMIF.

In 2015, the committee met four times, notably to examine the quarterly and annual financial results of the FGM and the FGMIF, and to monitor the implementation of technological platforms developed and/or installed during the year. The Access Funds platform was initiated to allow our fund creators to perform online tracking and to have access at all times to the market value of their funds and to the list of transactions.

The Foundation's 2015 financial results were excellent, generating an excess of revenues over expenses of \$2.6 million. In addition, thanks to the evolution of the markets and the contributions obtained, the FGM funds rose from \$81.6 million to \$84.3 million during the period ended December 31, 2015.

Working closely with the FGM's permanent team, the committee paid particular attention to the introduction of cutting-edge technological tools aimed at supporting a constant growth of funds, both those of its own and those managed on behalf of third parties, while making it possible to offer better client service to our fund creators. Business processes were also reviewed with the goal of optimizing management along with accountability for fund creators.

## COMMUNICATIONS TEAM EXPANDS ITS ROLE

The year 2015 has proven to be a very busy one for the Communications team at the Foundation. The restructuring of the Communications department at the FGM meant there were multiple tasks to achieve whilst the FGM's participation in many different events and initiatives brought a significant increase in the organization's visibility, especially in the second half of the year. A new committee of communications experts was established as part of a new strategic vision favoring a more integrated collaboration with the other departments of the FGM.

### BUSY SCHEDULE OF EVENTS BRINGS HEIGHTENED VISIBILITY

The Communications team contributed to organize and promote the FGM's many public events in 2015. One of the highlights was the much-anticipated release of the 7<sup>th</sup> edition of *Greater Montréal's Vital Signs*, presented at a special event to the Board of Trade of Metropolitan Montréal. This checkup for the socio-economic health of the region generated great interest and media coverage—including numerous newspaper articles, and several radio and television interviews with Yvan Gauthier, the FGM President and CEO.

The team was also involved in organizing National Philanthropy Day at the FGM and in managing public appearances by Foundation representatives.



### TARGETING A GREATER ROLE FOR THE FGM

In both marketing and public relations, a number of important endeavours were completed with the aim of raising awareness of the FGM among the public and the philanthropic milieu in Montréal. An advertisement featuring the personal experience of a donor was created, along with a series of five video capsules. Four newsletters and many different press releases were distributed over the course of the year as well.

### A STRONGER PRESENCE ON SOCIAL MEDIA

Our new social network specialist has made it easier for the FGM to plan, design and increase its presence on social networks such as Twitter and Facebook. Optimizing how we use these new platforms will be a priority in the year to come.
