## A COMMUNITY WITH A HEART

In 2016, the Foundation of Greater Montréal demonstrated even more its ability to take action and serve as a vehicle for conveying the generosity of Greater Montréal's citizens. In this capacity, The Foundation helped respond to numerous social needs such as welcoming Syrian refugees, assisting homeless people, and supporting victims of domestic violence. A human scale territory, the Greater Montréal is able to express real concerns and care for those in need.

During this fiscal year, the Foundation of Greater Montréal received record donations of \$58.8 million, raising its assets under management to nearly \$250 million. The assets managed by the FGM Investment Fund generated a return of 8.5% in 2016 and the gross weighted average return for the last five years was 9.1%. Our foundation is growing. Over the past five years, our assets nearly doubled, increasing by \$115 million, while the number of our philanthropic funds rose nearly 50%, to 509. These numbers reflect the generosity of both citizens and organizations from the Greater Montréal.

It has already been 17 years since a small and dedicated team founded the network of Community Foundations that today counts 191 organizations like ours all over Canada. With its innovative model based on building philanthropic funds and advising fund creators on how to contribute to the community, the Foundation of Greater Montréal has become a crossroad of compassion by building bridges between means and needs. Since 1999, we distributed close to \$30 million to some 1,000 community organizations while supplying the investment leverage needed to ensure long-term support for action within the community.

As we are publishing the 2016 annual report, our organization is actively involved in developing Vital Signs 2017 of Greater Montréal. We undertook this project to measure Montréal's social state of affairs 10 years ago, but the current edition under development will be noteworthy. It will focus entirely on the state of children in the Greater Montréal. Children are the future and central to the concerns of our community. By understanding needs, putting donations to work and supporting community organizations, we contribute to the betterment of the population of the Greater Montréal.

The Board reviewed the by-laws, the internal governance manual, the code of ethics for directors and committee members, along with the delegation of authority. I wish to extend my profound gratitude to our outgoing directors, Normand Grégoire, Roland Lescure, Sam Scalia, and Michael Novak, as well as the current Board members. Our Board is a dedicated group of women and men who have a broad range of knowledge and a great diligence to help the Foundation of Greater Montréal grow and fulfill its mission of community assistance.

Finally, on behalf of the Board, I would like to reiterate our utter confidence in our President and CEO and his team. The Foundation of Greater Montréal is in good hands, and 2017 looks to be a promising year.

# An exceptional year: **\$58.8 million** in donations and a high investment yield

## INVESTMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The assets managed by the FGM and its Investment fund reached \$249M in 2016. As for the assets of the Foundation of Greater Montréal Investment Fund (FGMIF), it reached \$203M in 2016. It represents an increase of \$17.7M compared to last year. The increase is due to the investment income of \$10M, net contributions of \$3.1M (contributions of \$11.5M and withdrawals of \$8.4M), the unrealized change in fair value of investments of \$4.6M. The FGMIF's gross weighted average yield over the past five years was 9.1%; for 2016, it yielded 8.5%. Over the past four years, the FGMIF surpassed its goal of adding 3% to the inflation index (CPI) (8.9% vs. 4.5%).

In 2016, the committee proposed recruiting an external investment manager for the FGMIF assets, which the Board approved at the end of this year. The firm chosen to act in this capacity was Mercer. This decision will allow the committee to better concentrate on the strategic issues and build a sophisticated portfolio adapted to the objectives of yields and risk of the FGM while submitting itself to the statutory standards of the AMF. With its expertise and size, this management firm also opens to a broader choice of financial instruments, allowing the FGMIF portfolio to become more diversified.

Thank you to all the members who participated actively to the committee, which held five meetings in 2016, in particular our outgoing chair, Normand Grégoire, who led the development and implementation of the new investment policy and the transfer of the FGMIF portfolio management to Mercer.

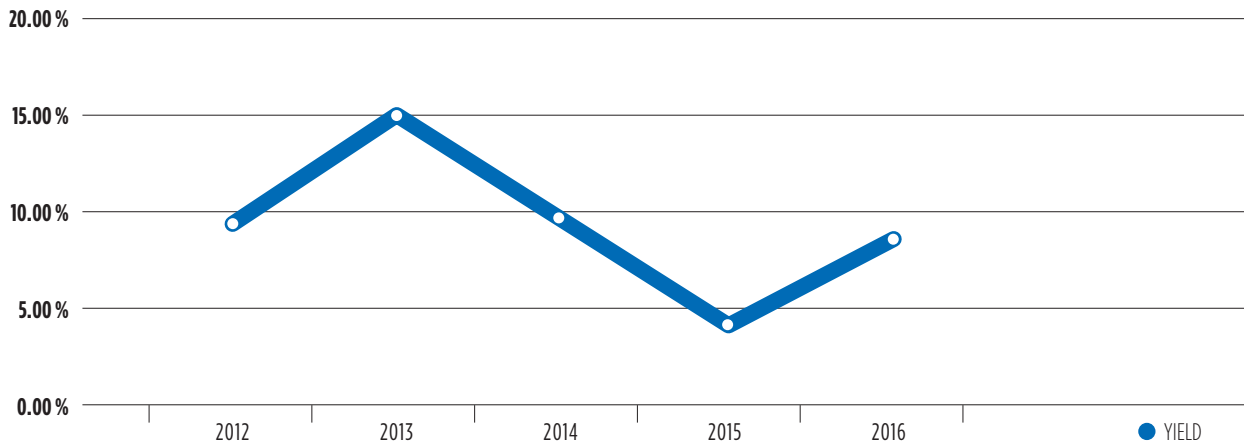

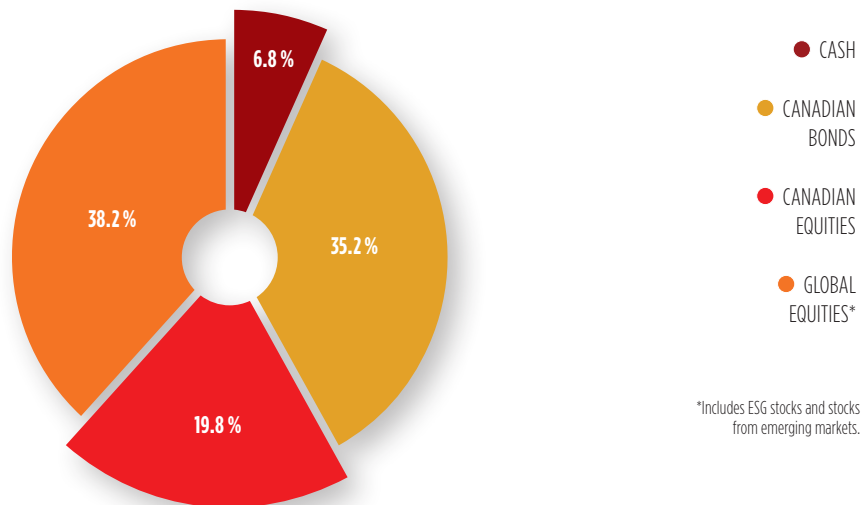

### THE ROLE OF THE FGMIF

The FGM Investment Fund (FGMIF) was created in 2004. Its objective is to generate greater revenue by pooling assets of the funds. The FGMIF's orientations are guided by the foundation's investment policy, and its legal framework is subject to the Autorité des marchés financiers (AMF). The rules of the AMF provide guidelines for the obligations of the investment fund manager while taking into account the fund's specificities, such as the obligation of accountability to fund holders (financial statements, portfolio performance, ect.). Governance of the FGMIF is subject to the rules and supervision of the FGM Board of Directors and its Investment Committee.

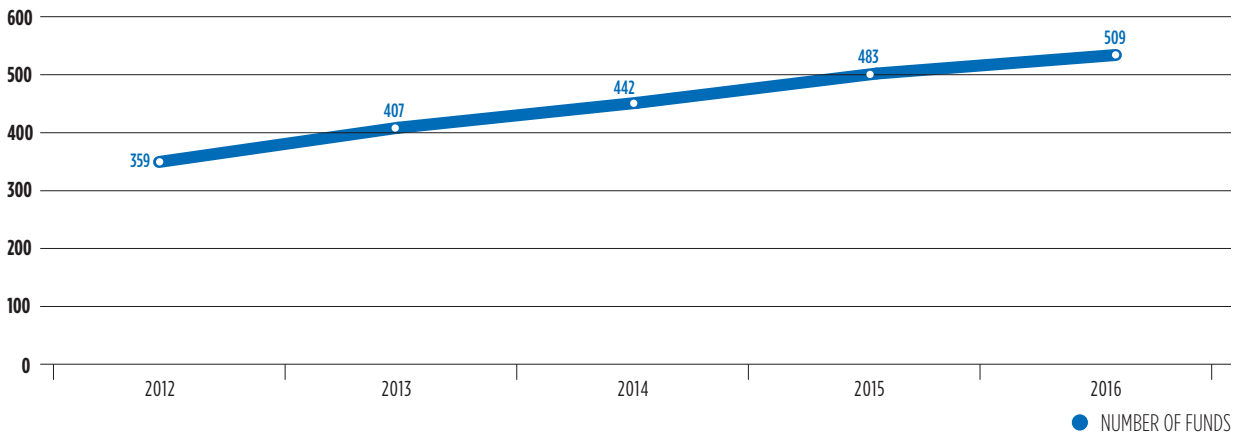

# GOVERNMENT PARTNERSHIPS IN PHILANTHROPY

## MÉCÉNAT PLACEMENTS CULTURE PROGRAM

Operated by the Ministère de la Culture et des Communications du Québec, this program encourages donations to cultural and communications organizations by offering matching grants to their fundraising campaigns. To take advantage of the program, eligible organizations must create a fund with a community foundation partner.

As of December 2016, the FGM managed a total of 296 funds as part of this program, 15 of which were created this year. In 2016, the Québec government contributed \$2,555,702 in matching grants to the FGM funds of participating organizations. In addition to this governmental program, the "Mécénat Musica" program, initiated by the Fondation Mécénat Musica to promote musical patronage, added assets of \$985,081 as private donations to the endowment funds of 19 musical organizations in the Montréal region.

## CANADIAN HERITAGE PROGRAM

Under the Canada Cultural Investment Fund (Endowment Initiatives component), Canadian Heritage program encourages private donors to play an active role in cultural life by contributing to the endowment funds of professional performing arts organizations created within community foundations.

In 2016, the FGM managed a total of 37 funds created under this program. During the year, the Canadian government contributed \$452,033 in matching grants to the FGM funds of participating organizations.

## PLACEMENTS SPORTS PROGRAM

The Placements Sports program is funded by the Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport and operated by SPORTS QUÉBEC, a corporation that promotes and defends the interests of the sporting community. The program encourages donations by providing matching grants to FGM endowment funds for contributions generated by the fundraising campaigns of Québec sports federations.

In 2016, the FGM managed a total of 56 funds created under this program, three of which were created this year. A total of \$1,470,020 was contributed to the FGM funds of participating sports federations.

## COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

In 2016, the FGM established numerous community partnerships in support of important causes, leading the way to investment in key areas. Working closely with the Red Cross and Community Foundations of Canada (CFC), the FGM helped welcome Syrian refugees. It joined Centraide's Collective Impact Project, with six other private foundations, to reduce poverty in 17 neighbourhoods on the Island of Montréal. The FGM worked with the Peace Grantmakers Network to hold a forum on the issue of violence against women held in December.

In preparation for the year celebrating Montréal's 375<sup>th</sup> and Canada's 150<sup>th</sup> of 2017, the 2016 community grants program call for proposals was made in partnership with the CFC's Community Fund for Canada's 150<sup>th</sup>, which matched FGM grants for 57 projects central to the concerns of Greater Montréal. Also, 15 other key projects (supported over a period of three years) also received FGM grants. These projects are aimed at building stronger communities, encouraging the integration of art into the community, ensuring student retention a healthy environment, inclusion, and Montréalers engagement.

The committee held two meetings over the past year. The FGM thanks the committee members for their commitment and thoroughness during the selection process.<sup>1</sup>

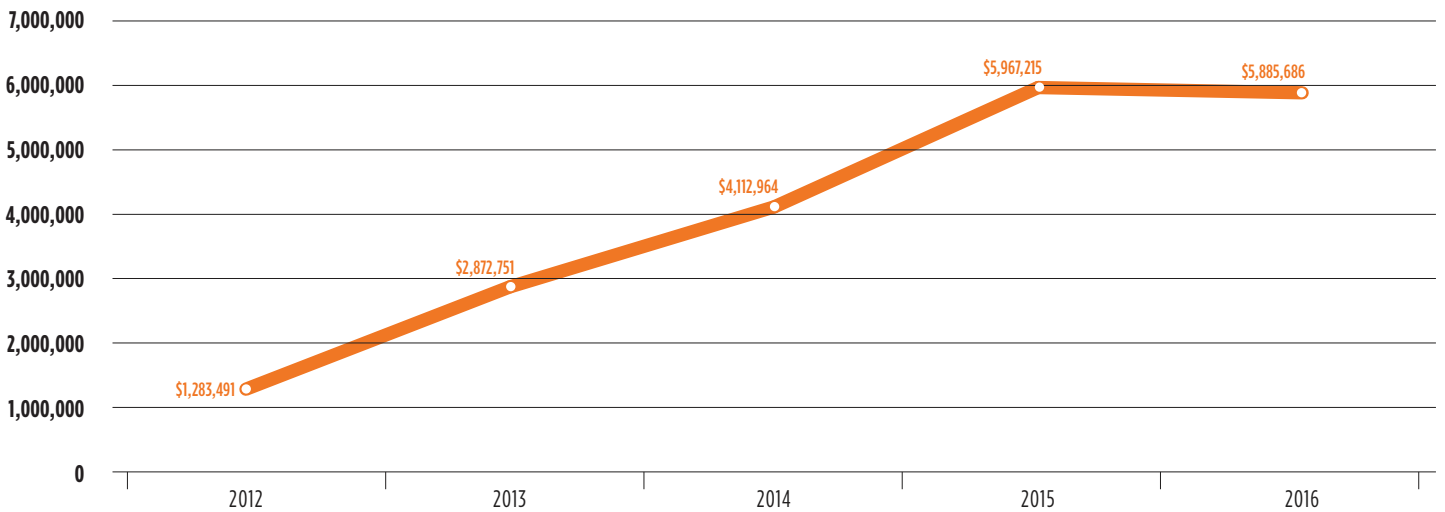

## COLLECTIVE IMPACT PROJECT

The FGM joined six other foundations to initiate the Collective Impact Project launched by Centraide to reduce poverty. The project aims to accelerate change in community improvements for Montréal.

A total of \$21 million will be invested over five years in 17 neighbourhoods on the Island of Montréal.

## THE WELCOME FUND FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES

The Montréal community spontaneously welcomed over 5,000 Syrian refugees. Nearly 95% of refugees from the Greater Montréal were sponsored by families and individuals.

Community Foundations of Canada created the Welcome Fund for Syrian Refugees with generous contributions from CN, Manulife, and other companies. The FGM partnered with the Canadian Red Cross to support the community and complement the efforts of sponsoring organizations in order to help integrate these newcomers within our society.

## VIOLENCE AGAINST GIRLS AND WOMEN

As illustrated in the previous edition of Vital Signs, violence against women and young girls is a serious, but unfamiliar issue in the Greater Montréal.

On December 8, 2016, a forum was held for stakeholders working in both research and intervention to discuss ways of improving the situation of women and young girls who have suffered from violence in our society.

**AUDIT COMMITTEE REPORT**

The audit committee is made up of seven people: five members of the Board and two external members. The committee's mandate is to advise the Board and to make recommendations pertaining to FGM's financial management in terms of budget, operational and accounting systems. It also examines the auditor's report, the audited financial statements of the Foundation of Greater Montréal, and the FGM Investment Fund (FGMIF).

The committee also makes recommendations to the Board concerning the appointment of auditors and their remuneration, and it supervises the overall audit program of the FGM and the FGMIF.

The committee met five times in 2016 to follow up on the quarterly and annual results of the FGM and FGMIF, as well as to examine the overall IT situation, fees schedule, the feasibility of creating a second Investment fund with a different investment policy, the possibility of becoming a paperless office, and the implementation of a computerized HR system.

The FGM's 2016 financial results were exceptional and showed an excess of revenue over expenses of \$53.9 million. Moreover, given the market changes and the contributions received, the funds managed by the FGM rose from \$84.3 million to \$137.4 million during the period ending December 31, 2016. Working very closely with the FGM's permanent staff, the committee undertook an evaluation of its technology to sustain growth while providing the best possible services for our fund creators.

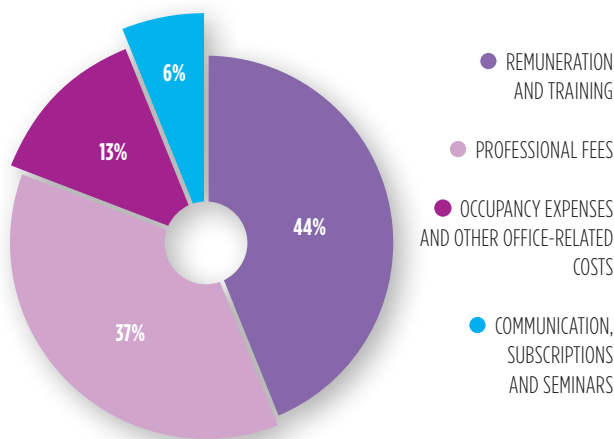

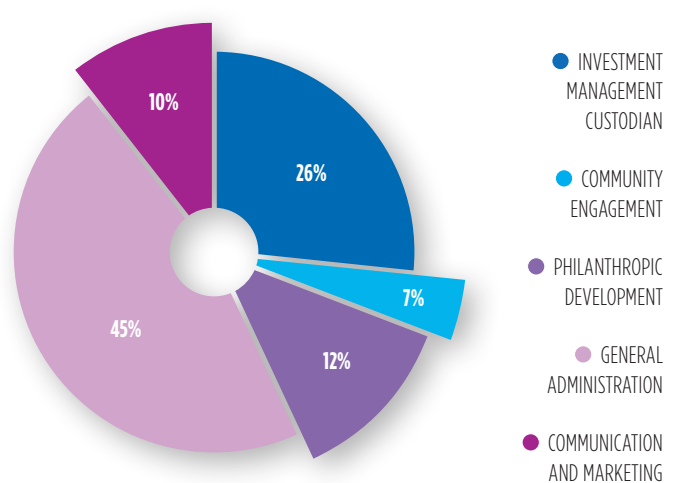

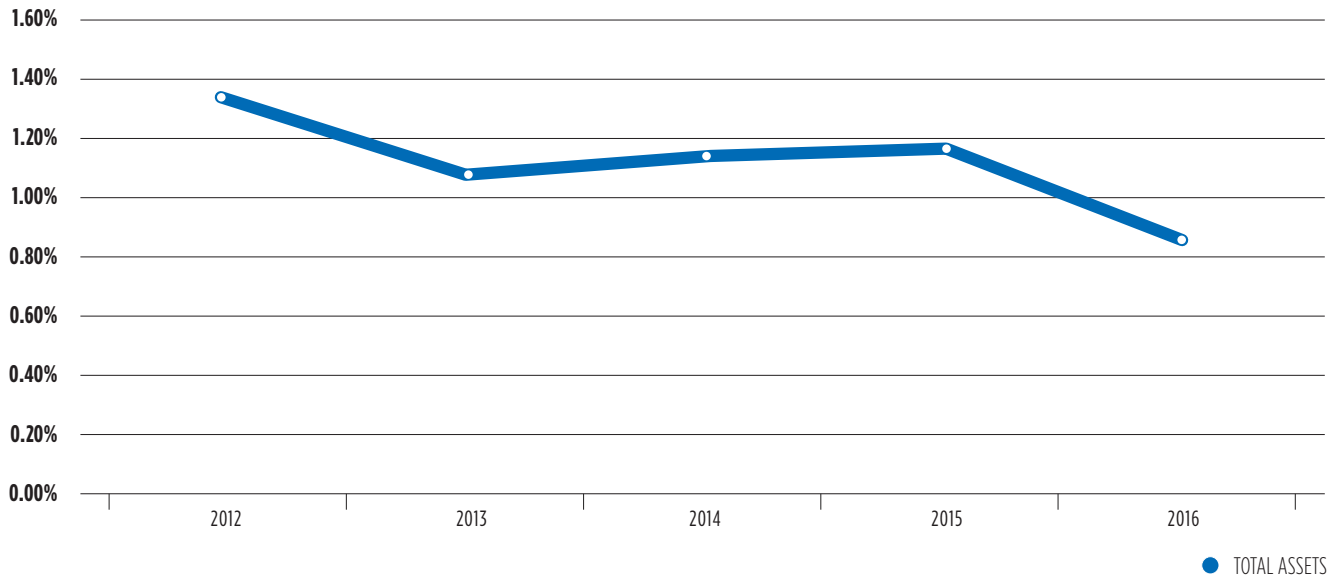
**OPERATING EXPENSES BY CATEGORY**
