A WORD FROM THE CHAIR AND FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CEO



A YEAR OF CELEBRATIONS AND ENGAGEMENT

2017 was a turning point that brought many economic, social, cultural and business projects to successful completion. As a whole, these endeavors had such a structuring effect that Greater Montréal seems to have picked itself up and turned its back on its difficulties of the early 2000s. We can now look with confidence to the coming decades.

Remarkable economic growth. Decreased unemployment. Many achievements around Montréal's 375th anniversary. We will remember the glorious and ambitious ones, of course, but also the smaller, local projects for the City's citizens that strengthened Montréal's community fabric. The FGM had greater public presence with more communications of its compelling messages. The release of the 2017 *Vital Signs* report, which was devoted to Greater Montréal's children, had a powerful impact. We reported progress in school perseverance and sounded an alarm about unacceptable conditions, like the hunger and poverty found in many Montréal boroughs.

Fortunately, a sustainable philanthropy and culture of sharing is taking hold that is dynamic and innovative. Although the successes being experienced in Greater Montréal bring great hope and energy, we must sustain our efforts to better target and attack major issues to increase social well-being.

Over the past year, philanthropy has indeed continued on its momentum of collaboration between private and public foundations, government and community stakeholders, and communities of all origins.

This is the greatest vital sign of our community!

A profitable year for the FGM: Managed assets go from \$249 million to \$292 million

INVESTMENT COMMITTEE REPORT

The assets of the Foundation of Greater Montréal Investment Fund (FGMIF) reached \$254.2 million in 2017, which was an increase of \$51.1 million from the previous year. The increase stems from net investment income of \$39.4 million, net contributions of \$32.3 million (contributions of \$41.5 million and withdrawals of \$9.2 million) and the unrealized change in fair value of investments of \$20.6 million.

The FGM's gross weighted average yield over the past five years was 9.1%; for 2017, it yielded 9.6%. Over the past four years, the FGMIF surpassed its goal of adding 3% to the inflation index (CPI) (7.6% vs. 4.1%). The assets managed by the FGM and its investment fund reached \$292.2 million in 2017.

In early 2017, after an external investment manager was hired for the FGMIF assets, the new investment policy was implemented. Over the year, the Committee reviewed the desired performance of the policy and decided to invest some assets in real estate to diversify the portfolio, to lighten the load of fixed-income classes and to increase ESG stocks.

Thank you to all the members who participated actively in the Committee, which held five meetings in 2017.

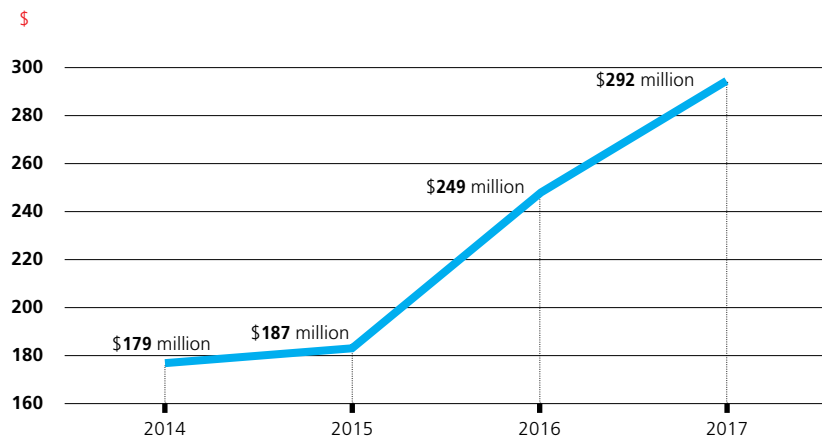

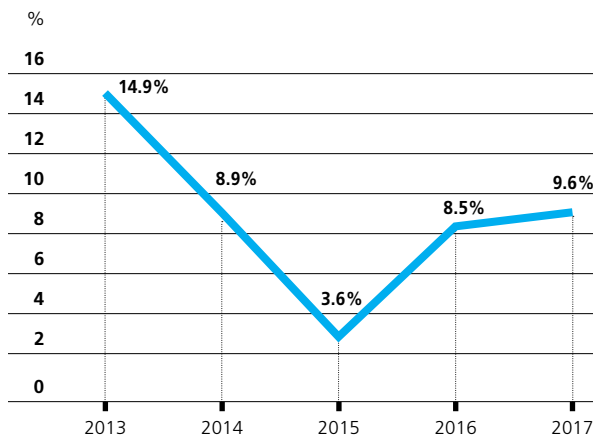

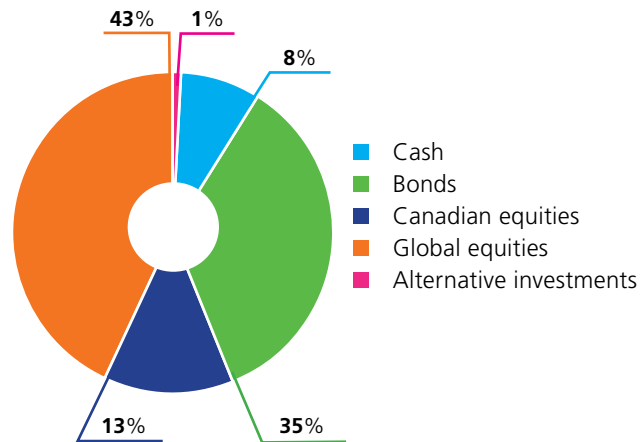

ROLE OF THE FGMIF

The FGM Investment Fund (FGMIF) was created in 2001, and its trust fund in 2004. Its objective is to generate greater revenue by pooling assets of the funds. The FGMIF's orientations are guided by the Foundation's Investment Policy, and its legal framework is subject to the Autorité des marchés financiers (AMF). The AMF's rules guide for the obligations of the investment fund manager while taking into account the fund's specificities, such as the obligation of accountability to fund holders (financial statements, portfolio performance, etc.). Governance of the FGMIF is overseen by the FGM Board of Directors and its Investment Committee, and the fund is subject to their rules.

CULTURE

Mécénat placements culture program

Administered by the **Quebec Ministère de la Culture et des Communications**, this program encourages private donations to organizations in the cultural and communications sectors by matching net fundraising amounts. To benefit from this program, eligible organizations must create a fund with a community partner foundation.

In 2017, FGM managed 330 funds under this program, for a total of \$105,600,865, 34 of which were created in 2017. The Government of Quebec contributed \$4,813,684 in matching grants to the FGM funds of participating organizations.

Canadian Heritage program

As part of the Canada Cultural Investment Fund (Endowment Incentives), **Canadian Heritage** encourages private donors to play an active role in the arts and cultural sector by contributing to the funds of professional cultural organizations, created with a community partner foundation.

In 2017, the FGM managed a total of 42 funds under this program, 6 of which were created this year. The Government of Canada paid out \$1,972,460 in matching grants to the FGM funds of participating organizations.

SPORTS

The Placements Sports program is funded by the **Ministère de l'Éducation, du Loisir et du Sport** and administered by SPORTSQUÉBEC, a corporation promoting and defending the interests of the sports community.

In 2017, the FGM managed a total of 57 funds under this program, for a total of \$1.7 million, including 2 of which were created this year. A total of \$607,764 in matching grants was paid out to the FGM funds of participating sports federations.

Nearly \$15 million paid out in grants to over 300 organizations in 2017

Over this historic year of Montréal's 375th and Canada's 150th celebrations, the FGM looked to the future. This is why it devoted its 2017 *Vital Signs of Greater Montréal* report to children, ages 0–17, and gave them a special role in its activities, particularly by organizing workshops and a day-long forum to hear their points of view on the issues that affect them.

This year, the Community Engagement Committee piloted a community initiatives program that supported 54 promising initiatives in the community by pairing investments by Community Foundations of Canada and the FGM. The \$606,000 investment was matched by the receiving organizations, for a total of \$1.2 million. The projects that received support contributed to building a stronger and more inclusive community through citizen

participation and by focusing on the arts, school perseverance and a healthy environment.

The FGM paid out nearly \$15 million in grants to over 300 organizations in 2017.

The Committee met six times over the year. The FGM would like to thank all of Committee members for their rigor and engagement in the selection process, as well as for their strategic recommendations for improving community well-being.

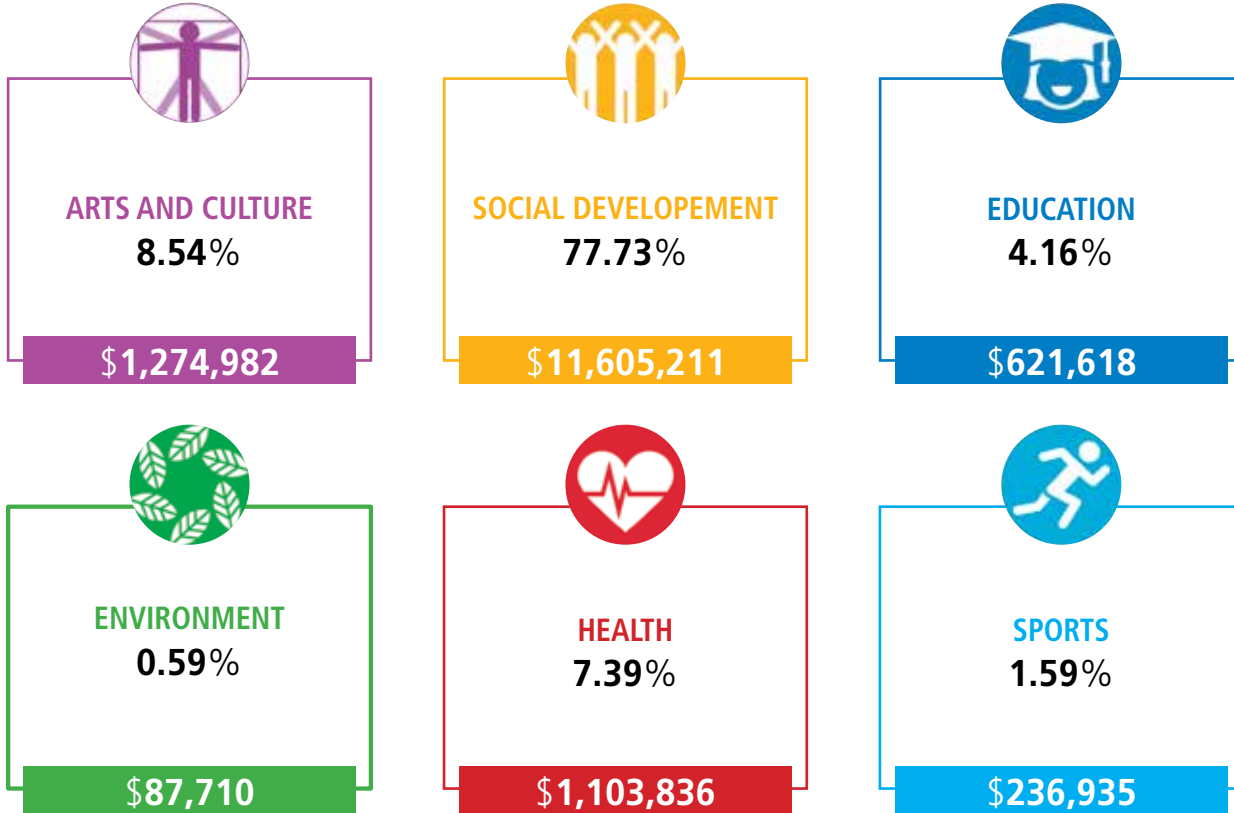

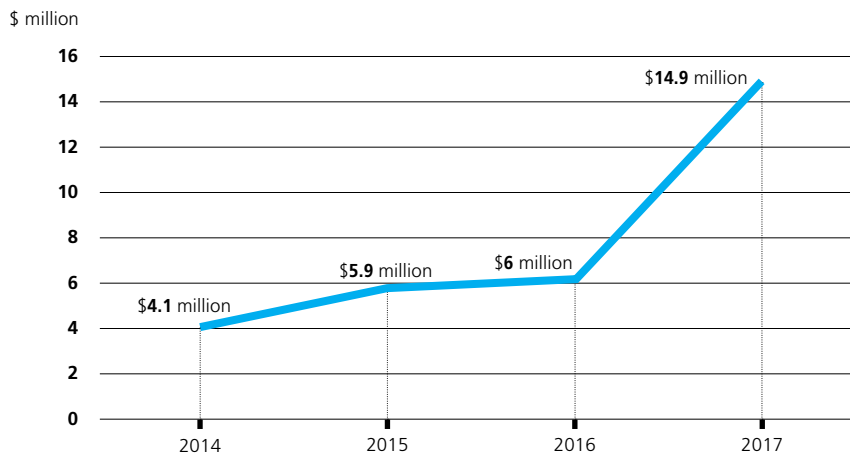

2017 Vital Signs

■ The Data

In 2017, the Foundation of Greater Montréal published a special edition of its Vital Signs™ report, dedicated to children. Ten of the United Nations' 17 Sustainable Development Goals were measured for Montréal, like in the UNICEF *Innocenti Report Card 14*.

The resulting publication was released at an event on October 3, 2017, in partnership with the Chamber of Commerce of Metropolitan Montreal. Four panels were then formed to discuss the priorities laid out in the report: poverty, food security, mental health and the urban environment.

■ The Vital Signs Listen to children

The FGM supported a project of listening to the ideas of children throughout the year. Groups of children from various boroughs or experiencing particular living conditions took part in reflections on the issues that affect them.

To highlight the impact of children's citizen involvement and the importance of listening to their voices, the FGM held the Vital Signs Forum at the Montreal Museum of Fine Arts on November 20 for Universal Children's Day. The Honourable Landon Pearson, UNICEF's Alli Trusdale, the Université de Montréal's Juan Torres and Concordia University's Natasha Blanchet Cohen were all in attendance, in addition to over 50 children, who presented their ideas and points of view on their priorities. They presented Valérie Plante, the new mayor of Montréal, with *Montréal as Desired by Children and the study Living in Montréal in the 21st century* reports. Several innovative organizations working with youth spoke to share their experiences and reflections.

The FGM would like to thank the J.W. McConnell Family Foundation, the organizing committee, the contributing organizations and participants, as well as the Museum of Fine Arts for hosting the event.

Other partnerships

■ Welcome Fund for Syrian Refugees

Thanks to generous contributions by CN and Manuvie, this special fund created by Community Foundations of Canada allowed the FGM to pursue its partnership with the Red Cross to support the Greater Montréal community in welcoming Syrian refugees. In 2017, a total of \$329,100 was distributed to four organizations to help them help these newcomers integrate our society. Thanks to this program, \$610,350 has been divided among 21 projects in Greater Montréal since 2016.

■ Collective Impact Project (CIP)

For a second year, the FGM pursued its work in the Collective Impact Project alongside eight other foundations. An leverage for change aiming for innovation, collaboration and increased mobilization, this project will make it possible to invest \$23 million over 5 years into poverty-fighting initiatives in 17 neighbourhoods on the island of Montréal.

■ Violence against women and girls

In November, the Peace Grantmakers Network (PGM) published a report following on the **"Violence Against Women and Girls and Its Impact on Children"** forum, organized by the PGN in collaboration with the Canadian Women's Foundation, FGM and the Fondation Lucie et André Chagnon's Observatoire des tout-petits. The report sheds light on the 12 recommendations for tangible actions to eliminate violence against women and children in Quebec.

■ Listening platform

The FGM was a member of the strategy committee of the Grande plateforme d'écoute, which seeks to lend an ear to all the different communities in the city. This platform gathers various Montréal-based organizations as a venue for sharing methods and content in the goal of creating an observatory of Montréal narratives. It also offers support for designing actions in the field to make Greater Montréal more inclusive, innovative and resilient.

CONSULTING CITIZENS

Montréal and its neighbourhoods were featured in 2017 in this great opportunity to look collectively to the future and take concrete action. A bike-powered consultation booth—La Bécane à idées—travelled the city over the summer, collecting Montrealers' ideas for improving their city as part of La Grande Tournée event for Montréal's 375th anniversary. After citizens' dreams for their city were gathered, the MUEC analyzed the data and created five themed posters to present the most popular ideas.

The "Rituels II Fragments" project at the Museum of Jewish Montreal (MJM) launched a cultural program connected with three temporary exhibitions, displayed from August 2017 to January 2018. The project aimed to (re)create and explore ritualized experiences in relation to Montréal's Jewish cultures. Locals from all cultural backgrounds were also treated to a host of complementary activities including vernissages, workshops, performances and conferences that rounded out the exhibitions.

INCLUDING THE PHYSICALLY DISABLED

This project was intended to encourage the social inclusion and active participation of the community centre's physically disabled members in the festivities for Canada's 150th and Montréal's 375th anniversaries. The centre orchestrated several activities, thematic visits and talks to celebrate the two major anniversaries. It also offered workshops to teach users to use the event apps on a digital tablet and created a photo album of the project's main activities.

CREATING DISCUSSIONS BETWEEN COMMUNITIES

Through an exploratory performance experience combining the spoken word with new technology, a series of screens breaks up the geographic reality to permit a timely discussion between Montrealers and three Elders from different Indigenous communities in Quebec. One of the project's main goals was to give people from these Indigenous communities an opportunity to speak and share their culture, but also their life stories. Above all, it was a chance to create discussions between groups that don't typically get that opportunity since they live hundreds of kilometers apart, and to enable the Indigenous representatives to meet with the Montréal community.

GIVING SENIORS ACCESS TO THE ARTS

The Société pour les arts en milieux de santé (SAMS) organized a first round of shows of *Cueilleurs de mémoires*, an artistic mediation project funded by the FGM in 2016 and inspired by 100 seniors living in healthcare institutions. In all, the project reached 750 seniors, their families and the caregiving staff. With a mission to increase appreciation of the arts and improve the quality of life in hospitals, the SAMS generated extremely edifying and meaningful interactions with residents, patients, their families and especially with the seniors living in residences.

MIXING COMMUNITIES

For this project, two designers—one from Quebec and one who immigrated to Quebec—were hired to lead workshops for ethnically diverse women's groups. The women are invited to share their traditional dress and then create an outfit melding Quebec and their own cultures. The goal of the project is to unite women from various communities and encourage them to participate in a project that mixes cultural expressions while fostering participants' pride. The *Mé-tisse ta communauté* workshops are now underway and will present the final works in a fashion show at the Jardins Gamelin on July 21, 2018.

Rooted in a multi-cultural, working-class neighbourhood, the project came to life as a series of gatherings to share knowledge about Indigenous and other cultures through collective kitchens based on Indigenous recipes, film debates on the Canadian identity and an introduction to medicinal plants used by Indigenous nations.

AUDIT COMMITTEE REPORT

The Audit Committee is made up of seven members: four Board members and three external members.

The Committee met five times in 2017 to follow up on the quarterly and annual results of the FGM and FGMIF (including the budget preparation process and its regular follow-up), as well as to keep abreast of several dossiers, including the FGM fee schedule, the structure of the funds offered to the market, selecting the IT service provider and risk management.

The FGM's 2017 financial results were exceptional as they exceeded our budgetary goals and showed an excess of revenue over expenses

of **\$30.4 million**. Moreover, given the market changes and the contributions received, the funds managed by the FGM rose from **\$137.4 million to \$167.7 million** during the period ending December 31, 2017. Working very closely with the FGM's permanent staff, the committee worked toward improving its technology to sustain consistent growth of the funds—those held by the FGM and those managed for others—while providing the best possible services for our fund creators.

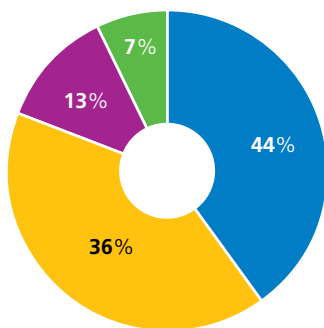

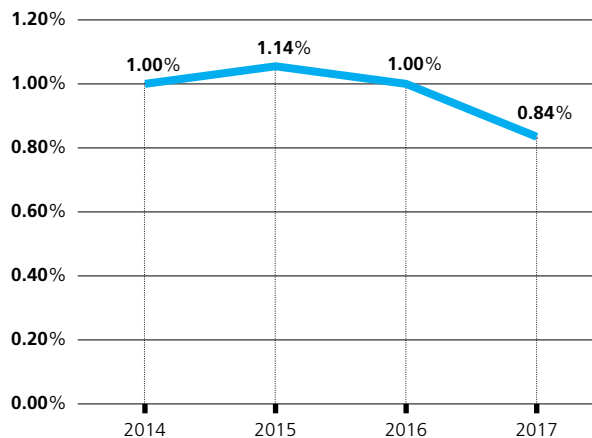
