

A WORD FROM THE CHAIR AND FROM THE PRESIDENT AND CEO



Montréal's star is rising but not everyone is benefitting equally

In 2018, Greater Montréal posted the strongest economic growth among Canada's 13 largest cities.¹ Signs of prosperity are everywhere, with a boom in high-rise construction, massive investments in infrastructure and Montréal's growing international appeal. This exciting economic momentum, combined with government measures, is leading to a reduction in poverty. This is a wonderful development and a realization of the vision expressed during Montréal's 375th anniversary celebrations.

However, not everyone is benefitting from this momentum equally. Poverty may be declining, but we're still on thin ice. In terms of personal income, Greater Montréal is still lagging far behind its Canadian counterparts. Affordable housing is being converted into condos while yesterday's working class neighbourhoods are becoming gentrified and beyond the reach of low-income earners. Families are being pushed out to areas that are farther from both schools and amenities. Food insecurity in Montréal remains among the highest in the nation: more than one in ten children, workers and seniors don't have enough to eat.

ERADICATING INEQUALITIES BY PRIORITIZING THE ZERO HUNGER AND NO POVERTY GOALS

The Foundation of Greater Montréal (FGM) is now aligning all its actions with the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs), a worldwide movement to transform our world. More specifically, in response to the serious issues of hunger and poverty highlighted in our 2017 *Vital Signs of Greater Montréal* report, we're taking action.

We have mobilized community, philanthropic, public and private actors around Zero Hunger (SDG 2), identified levers and gaps, compiled existing knowledge on the topic and documented the food ecosystem to assess the current situation. Our goal is to ensure a deeper understanding of the issues that will allow coordinated and targeted investments to reduce food insecurity.

As part of the No Poverty (SDG 1) goal, we are actively participating in the Collective Impact Project (CIP) with eight other foundations and government bodies to support impactful community-based projects and their champions, in a concerted effort to alleviate poverty.

But that's not all: the grants from our funds meet multiple goals including Quality Education (SDG 4), Sustainable Cities and Communities (SDG 11) and Good Health and Well-being (SDG 3). Last but not least, we are part of the Canadian and global coalition that is working towards major transformations by 2030.

THE FOUNDATION OF GREATER MONTRÉAL IS GROWING

In 2018, 111 new philanthropic funds and foundations were established at FGM, while total donations and contributions surpassed \$40 million. New contributions reached \$145 million over the last three years. The Foundation of Greater Montréal would like to democratize philanthropy, in other words, make it easier for individuals to set up a fund to support their chosen causes, for example by offering online and mobile tools. This service is what makes FGM unique and is the reason why community organizations and philanthropists seek to partner with us. Thank you for doing your part to make sure everyone shares in Greater Montréal's prosperity.





FGM assets surpass \$300 million

The Foundation of Greater Montréal set a new record in 2018. According to the financial results for the year ended December 31, 2018, assets under management surpassed \$300 million, reaching \$308 million at year-end.




Over \$145 million in donations and contributions over the last three years



A record-breaking 111 new funds in 2018

In 2018, 111 individuals, families and charitable organizations decided to establish funds to support causes that are important to them. This record brings the number of active funds to 650 as at December 31, 2018.



TOTAL FUNDS AS AT DECEMBER 31, 2018




10-year gross return of 7.6%

FGM's 10- and 5-year gross return is, respectively, 7.6% and 5.9%. FGM posted a return of -1% for the year ended December 31, 2018. Market prices fell just about everywhere in 2018 while bond yields remained flat due to interest rate hikes. While this performance is disappointing, the FGMIF fared relatively well compared to the benchmark portfolio, which was down 1.6%.

It should be noted that the FGMIF is composed of many passive strategies that by definition do not beat their benchmark. The Investment Committee's decision to include strategies such as the Mercer Global Low Volatility Equity Fund proved to be a good one as the fund delivered a return of 4.43% compared to its benchmark, which posted a loss of 0.49%. The ESG strategies also outperformed their benchmark, posting a positive return in 2018, as did the real estate fund, which generated a return of 5.38%.

ROLE OF THE FGMIF

The FGM Investment Fund (FGMIF) was created in 2004 to grow the funds' assets through a pooled investment strategy. The FGMIF's orientations are based on the FGM's investment policy and its legal framework is subject to the Autorité des marchés financiers (AMF). The FGMIF manager must comply with AMF rules and is accountable to fund holders (financial statements, portfolio performance, etc.). Governance of the FGMIF is subject to the rules and oversight of the FGM Board of Directors and its Investment Committee.

REPORT FROM THE INVESTMENT COMMITTEE

The assets of the Foundation of Greater Montréal Investment Fund (FGMIF) reached \$262.5 million in 2018, an increase of \$8.3 million from the previous year. This increase stems from net investment income of \$12.7 million, net contributions of \$12.4 million (contributions of \$29.8 million and withdrawals of \$17.4 million) and an unrealized change in fair value of investments of \$-16.8 million. FGM's 5-year gross return was 5.9%, compared to -1% in 2018. Stock fell just about everywhere in 2018 while bond returns were squeezed in response to rising interest rates. The FGMIF was somewhat shielded from the downturn due to a positive performance by ESG stocks, low-volatility strategies and the addition of real estate assets to the portfolio.

Over the last five years, the FGMIF has met its objective of generating the returns necessary for philanthropic distributions while covering the expenses required for sound management and covering cost of living increases. The assets managed by FGM and its investment fund reached \$308 million in 2018.

The Investment Committee, which met five times in 2018, reviewed the investment policy to revise its objectives and ensure its application. It discussed the use of tactical management and whether moving from passive to active management for certain asset classes would add value to the portfolio. As requested by fundholders, it also met with the portfolio managers to confirm that we are not holding investments in tax havens. Lastly, the Committee recommended to the Board a distribution rate based on the accumulated reserves.

Thank you to all the members who participated actively in the Committee this past year.

PORTRAITS OF DONORS AND THEIR FUNDS

FGM manages 650 individual, family, foundation, community organization and corporate funds. Everyone has their own story, motivation and causes they want to support. Here are some of them.

GALLOP FAMILY FOUNDATION FUND

W. John Gallop was among the first to open a family fund at FGM in 2001, shortly after the Foundation was established. He has been committed ever since. A few years later, his children joined the family fund as members of the advisory committee created to make donation recommendations.

“When I was younger, my volunteer commitments were primarily my time. But when I learned that I could build an enduring endowment, I was delighted to start FGM’s first donor-advised family fund. It began modestly nearly 20 years ago but I’m still adding to it regularly.”

I am now in my eighties and have found unexpected value in an FGM endowment. I have just made my adult children co-advisors. It was very easy to change, inspiring them to continue the tradition of giving back to the community.”

FONDS FONDATION FAMILLE LE BLANC

Created in 2016, the Fondation Famille Le Blanc fund was set up to give expression to Mr. and Mrs. Le Blanc’s desire to “give back to the community.” The couple was in their fifties when they started supporting various organizations and the HEC Foundation; they wanted to build a foundation that would support their commitments for the long-term.

“On a friend’s recommendation, we decided to join the Foundation of Greater Montréal. Since we were still active, it was clear to us that the FGM’s expertise would eliminate red tape and that we would get good advice. What resonated with us the most were youth-related causes, whether involving sports, arts or health. It’s important to mention that our two sons were very talented tennis players who won U.S. scholarships, which made life very easy for them. We felt that helping young people who weren’t as fortunate would be very rewarding and give us sense of accomplishment and purpose.”

By creating this fund, Mr. and Mrs. Le Blanc hope that their “example can serve others with different causes”, and that their “children and grandchildren will continue to support the Fondation Famille Le Blanc fund for years to come.”

FONDS FONDATION FAMILLE MORENCY

A long-time philanthropist for whom caring and empathy are core values, Mr. Morency has always supported charitable organizations. Wishing to further structure his philanthropic approach, he chose, with his family, to create a fund with FGM “to bring a certain discipline and more thought into the way I was giving” and to make a lasting commitment.

He chose FGM because “they’re flexible and make it easy to give, but also because of their expertise [...]. The ability to create an advisory committee to involve our children is very important and speaks to me. Doing this will help instill a culture of philanthropy in them.”

Focused on helping organizations working with children and families, the fund’s members also want to support small organizations working on a human scale.

For those wishing to engage in philanthropy, Mr. Morency suggests “surrounding yourself with people who share your values and vision. And don’t be afraid to ask for help and advice from people who work in this field. A committed philanthropist who takes an interest in the organizations he helps can multiply his contribution tenfold by inspiring others to give.”

CHAMANDY FOUNDATION FUND

“The Chamandy Foundation is committed to supporting children in all spheres of their development: education, rights, poverty, health and well-being. In December 2018, we chose to create a fund at the Foundation of Greater Montréal to support projects for children.”

CATHERINE ROWE AND JOHN DI GIRONIMO FAMILY FOUNDATION FUND

Catherine Rowe has always worked in philanthropy. As a philanthropist, she considers it essential *“to get involved personally in organizations. Both giving financial support and getting involved as a volunteer is ideal. The first step is educating oneself about organizations and the issues they deal with.”*

For her family, the idea of setting up a fund to support causes that matter to them came naturally.

“John and I decided that the timing was right to start it now so that we could all make decisions together as a family about the causes we want to support.”

Now Mrs. Rowe and her husband have also decided to set up a bequest to continue their commitment.

“When our children were approaching adulthood we realized it was time to update our wills and it was then that we made the decision to include philanthropy in our legacy. We discussed it as a family and it was a very lovely and positive experience. The decision gives us a way to influence the future for causes that have been important to us in our lifetime. It is very comforting to think that this will go on even after we are gone.”

The Catherine Rowe and John Di Gironimo Family Foundation fund is particularly concerned about the environment, which their daughters care deeply about, and is dedicated to supporting nurses.

“There are a number of causes and organizations that are important to us. One of the decisions I made when thinking of a legacy gift is to create a nursing fund at St. Mary’s Hospital – in honour of my mother, who was a nurse and had worked at St. Mary’s. The fund will help nurses to pursue their training when they might not otherwise be able to. This was a very meaningful decision for me.”

Other causes that have become important for us are related to the environment – our daughters are very involved and knowledgeable about these. We will be discussing each philanthropic decision as a family to choose the causes that are both important to us and impactful to our community.

Our interests have grown and evolved to include health, environment and music, but we also believe in maintaining loyalty to causes we have chosen so that the impact of our giving can be greater.”

Mrs. Rowe has long been involved in the causes that matter to her, and she has simple but smart advice for those who want to make a difference:

“Start today. Start by becoming informed about causes that are important to you personally. If you can, get involved, but whether it be your time or your money, act on your values and beliefs. And talk about the causes you support with others. Having more people actively engaged in philanthropy makes our community stronger and better.”

DIANA AND SAM SCALIA – CIBPA BURSARY FUND

Giving back is a way of life for Diana and Sam Scalia.

“My wife and I feel that we have been very fortunate in our careers as businesspeople. It is very important for us to give back to our community. We have always been involved.”

Mr. Scalia is a long-standing member of various boards and president of the CIBPA Foundation (Canadian Italian Business and Professional Association). In late 2018, he and his wife set up a fund to support bursaries awarded by the association.

“For us, creating endowment funds was a means to ensure more stable funding for the bursaries program. As a former board member myself, I know how serious FGM is. When the CIBPA started its reflection on creating an endowment fund, it was clear that we do not have the expertise or the resources to manage a fund. Therefore, I suggested that we have our funds managed at FGM. It is operating very well, has reasonable fees, and it is a very flexible and transparent organization. I knew it was the right thing to do.”

This bursary program is open to university students of Italian origin enrolled in any discipline or specialized program. Thanks to the advantages of a fund at FGM, this program could be extended to students at other levels, such as vocational training.

“With our funding more secure and stronger, we want to open up and set up a bursary program for students in trade school. Because we do need lawyers and doctors, but we also need plumbers, electricians, etc.”

Mr. Scalia’s advice to anyone who wants to become a philanthropist is to think carefully about issues that matter to them so that they can then spread the word. *“First, it has to come from the heart.*

Philanthropy is more than just writing cheques for charities. Being involved with them, knowing what they do, and knowing about their causes is much more satisfying. I also think philanthropists who get personally involved create more impact. They can help draw attention towards the causes or organizations they are contributing to.”

SOCIÉTÉ DES CÉLÉBRATIONS DU 375^e ANNIVERSAIRE DE MONTRÉAL

In spring 2018, the Société des célébrations du 375^e anniversaire de Montréal wanted to wrap up the year of festivities by bequeathing, in the form of funds, \$3.5 million to initiatives that strengthen the community. These funds will be used to improve food security, promote school perseverance, and relandscape schoolyards.

In terms of food security, this support translates into:

- + a \$25,000 grant for the FGM’s Zero Hunger in Montréal initiative, which aims to improve our knowledge of the food security ecosystem to allow more coherent and strategic investments;
- + the purchase of a refrigerated truck for Moisson Montréal allowing it to recover more meat from supermarkets, and financing for the acquisition of a kitchen that will be used to process food, particularly fruits and vegetables, in order to convert losses into viable foodstuff and offset lower availability in winter and spring when the needs of community organizations are greatest;
- + a contribution to Cantine pour tous projects to develop affordable quality meals to fight food insecurity.

In order to reduce the dropout rate, which is particularly high among students in grades 9-11, the Société des célébrations du 375^e anniversaire de Montréal has created a fund in partnership with Fusion Jeunesse.

A total of 375 bursaries of \$2,000 each will be awarded every year for three years to students who demonstrate perseverance, leadership, a positive attitude and the desire to continue their education. Ultimately, 1,125 Montréal students will have been encouraged to continue their education, for a total of \$2,250,000 in bursary payments.

A second fund, also created in the name of Fusion Jeunesse, encourages the beautification of 100 Montréal schoolyards by 2021. Guided by academics and advised by professionals in architecture, landscape and design, students will experience all the stages of an urban redevelopment project, from design to execution. Besides increasing their sense of belonging to their school and learning about the environment and urban planning, Montréal’s youths will become agents of change.

PHILANTHROPY INCENTIVE PROGRAMS

CULTURE

MÉCÉNAT PLACEMENTS CULTURE PROGRAM

(Ministère de la Culture et des Communications)

This program aims to ensure the independence and financial security of nonprofit organizations in the cultural and communications sectors by stimulating the creation of permanent funds and encouraging fundraising. The program has been subject to new rules since July.

As at December 31, 2018, there were 347 funds at FGM under this program, for a total value of \$109,809,892. Twenty-six new funds were created during 2018, for a total of \$1,905,589.

In 2018, the Québec government contributed \$7,296,441 in matching grants to the funds of participating organizations at FGM.

MÉCÉNAT MUSICA PROGRAM

(Foundation of Greater Montréal)

Mécénat Musica is a matching program created by a donor. It encourages individuals to make a gift in perpetuity of \$25,000 to a cultural organization that is important to them and it encourages philanthropic families to match it with a donation of \$250,000 or \$2,500,000. The program increases the amount of donations received by cultural organizations before they apply for a matching grant to the Mécénat Placements Culture and Canadian Heritage programs.

This year, five new organizations joined the program, which has been in existence since 2013, for a total of 28 organizations as at December 31, 2018. In 2018, Mécénat Musica contributed \$784,998 in matching grants to funds of participating organizations at FGM.

After an endowment fund was created for the McGill Chamber Orchestra (MCO), we received financial support from Mécénat Musica. I’d like to thank them for their generous contribution, which will help fund the MCO’s activities for many years.”

CANADIAN HERITAGE PROGRAM

(Department of Canadian Heritage)

The Endowment Incentives component of the Canada Cultural Investment Fund encourages arts organizations to build new revenue streams. The government provides a funding incentive for the donations collected.

In 2018, FGM managed 51 funds under this program, 9 of which were created this past year. In 2018, the Government of Canada distributed \$3,312,006 in matching grants to the funds of participating organizations at FGM.

To fulfill its role of promoting a philanthropic culture in Greater Montréal, FGM is a partner in philanthropy incentive programs.

Culture, communications, sports, education... Registered charities can establish a fund at FGM and apply to various programs for grants to match their fundraising efforts. These contributions help them develop and sustain their activities.

EDUCATION

PLACEMENT RÉUSSITE PROGRAM

(Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur)

Created in 2017, this program offered by the Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur is for organizations supporting school perseverance and educational success.

As at December 31, 2018, there were 51 funds under this program, with total assets of \$2,758,104.

In 2018, the Québec government contributed \$2,958,004 in matching grants to the funds of participating organizations at FGM.

"Besides helping with our fundraising efforts, the Placement Réussite Program has given Héritage Saint-Bernard and its education department a big boost. MÉCÉNAT RÉUSSITE AUTOCHTONES PROGRAM

(Foundation of Greater Montréal)

Mécénat Réussite Autochtones is a private grant matching program for organizations working in the education sector with Indigenous populations. It increases the amount of donations received by the organization before applying for a matching grant from the Placement Réussite program.

The Fondation Jasmin Roy qualified for this program in 2018.

SPORTS

PLACEMENTS SPORTS PROGRAM

(Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur)

The Placements Sports Program focuses on the creation of endowment funds to support Québec sports federations. Administered by Corporation Sports-Québec, the program aims to help federations increase the proportion of their income derived from donations.

In 2018, FGM managed 61 funds under this program (including 4 created during the year), for a total of \$6,257,360. A total of \$1,465,717 in matching grants was paid out to the funds of participating sports federations at FGM.

"The Placements Sports Program plays an integral role in enabling the Quebec Amateur Netball Federation to achieve its goals. Our mission is to provide an environment that fosters self-confidence and skills development. OUR COMMITMENT TO THE SUSTAINABLE DEVELOPMENT GOALS

“The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) agreed by the international community in 2015 represent an ambitious effort to set a global agenda for development that is both equitable and sustainable, in social, economic and environmental terms.”¹

In 2017, inspired by UNICEF’s *Innocenti Report Card 14*, FGM used 10 of the 17 SDGs to paint a picture of the situation of Greater Montréal’s children. The *Vital Signs* report compared their situation to that of children in Canada, Québec and other administrative regions. The findings for some indicators were alarming, particularly those concerning poverty and food insecurity.


A pioneer in Québec in measuring the vitality of its population through a sustainable development lens, FGM continued its initiatives for the well-being of the community by applying this new framework to its projects as of 2018. Taking into account the issues revealed by the *Vital Signs* report, it adapted its grantmaking Community Initiatives Program to the SDGs framework. It also participates in the Collective Impact Project (CIP) to reduce the impact of poverty. Montréal’s Zero

Hunger initiative, launched in 2018, reflects the desire to respond locally to these global issues in order to build a more sustainable and equitable community.


FGM now aligns all its activities and grantmaking with the SDGs. To this end, it has identified the major issues on which it intends to focus: SDG 1 No Poverty; SDG 2 Zero Hunger; SDG 3 Good Health and Well-being; SDG 4 Quality Education; SDG 11 Sustainable Cities and Communities; and SDG 16 Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions.

Over \$8.5 million distributed to advance the SDGs and Culture



To respect the multidimensional character of certain projects, the “multiple SDGs” parameter was added to the classification. Since arts and culture are essential to a community’s well-being and vitality, FGM has kept this sector a priority.



Grants distributed over five years as a percentage of assets is 6%.

The sharp increase in grant distributions in 2017 is explained by the more than \$10 million distributed by the Fonds Fondation de Claire et Jean-Pierre Léger that year.

REPORT FROM THE COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT COMMITTEE

The Committee met five times during the year. In 2018, the Foundation of Greater Montréal aligned its programs with the issues identified in the *2017 Vital Signs of Greater Montréal* report, which used the UN's Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) to paint a picture of 0-17-year-olds in our community.

The Community Engagement Committee spearheaded the Community Initiatives Program, awarding \$651,133 in grants for 49 projects aimed at improving the well-being of 0-17-year-olds. In May, the recipient organizations were invited to a gathering to present their projects and exchange ideas with their counterparts. The selected projects addressed the issues of Food Security (SDG 2), Mental Health (SDG 3), School Success (SDG 4), Healthy Environment (SDG 11) and No Violence (SDG 16).

In 2018, FGM and its partners focused extensively on the issue of food security. FGM launched a project to map the food security ecosystem in Montréal. A strategic committee was formed to bring together key government, community and philanthropic actors. This committee met eight times during the year. Phase 1 of the project involved a study, entitled *Meta-Synthesis of Publications on Food Security in Montréal since 2006*, whose findings were published on October 16 to coincide with World Food Day.

FGM also sponsored a longitudinal study, which involved listening to groups of children from different neighbourhoods to gain a deeper understanding of their sense of belonging to their communities and their views on issues that concern them. This study will continue until 2024. As well, the Foundation supported the Global Children's Designathon, a day where children have an opportunity to use new technologies to come up with ideas for creating a better world. During this event, children aged 7 to 12 from 30 cities, including Montréal, met virtually in real time to find innovative solutions on the theme of "Life on Land" (SDG 15).

Overall, FGM funds distributed more than \$8.5 million in grants to 467 organizations in 2018.

I would like to thank all the Committee members for their discipline and engagement in selecting the projects to be funded by the Community Initiatives Program, as well as for their strategic recommendations for improving community well-being.

NO POVERTY

End extreme poverty

THE COLLECTIVE IMPACT PROJECT

The Collective Impact Project is an innovation-driven, collaboration-based accelerator of change that seeks to increase the impact of collective action to fight poverty in 17 neighbourhoods on the Island of Montréal.

For the third year in a row, FGM continued to support this project, contributing \$150,000. Together with the project operator, Centraide

of Greater Montreal, FGM and eight other major foundations and three strategic partners have committed \$23 million over five years to support this strategic initiative that provides support tailored to each neighbourhood's reality. Five neighbourhoods are receiving intensive support: Saint-Michel, Centre-Sud, Saint-Léonard, Côte-des-Neiges and Parc-Extension.

Concurrently with this initiative, the FGM's funds support various organizations and projects aligned with the No Poverty goal. This is the case with the [Doggone Foundation Fund](#), which supports the [Salvation Army's Community and Family Services](#) and the organization [Emmaüs](#), which is also supported by the [Beatrice Enid Patterson Foundation Fund](#).

CENTRAIDE: COMBATING POVERTY AND EXCLUSION

ZERO HUNGER

End hunger and achieve food security and improved nutrition

2 ZERO HUNGER



Many organizations, foundations and donors are involved in the fight against hunger. Aside from the \$189,015 in grants awarded in 2018 to combat this problem on a daily basis, FGM and its contributors have allocated more than \$202,000 to Zero Hunger in Montréal, a project designed to deepen our understanding of the issue of hunger in Montréal in order to better guide collective and strategic investments.

ZERO HUNGER IN MONTRÉAL

The 2017 edition of *Vital Signs of Greater Montréal* identified hunger as one of the city's biggest and most pressing issues. In Montréal, 11% of households experience moderate or severe food insecurity, compared to the Canadian average of 8%.

To better determine the investments needed to address the problem of hunger, FGM realized that a tool was needed to represent Montréal's food security ecosystem. With this in mind, it formed a taskforce composed of partners from the public sector, community organizations and philanthropic foundations and in May 2018 launched a major project known as *Zero Hunger in Montréal*.

This project uses a collaborative approach to map out all the knowledge and actors as well as the challenges and opportunities in Greater Montréal. Not intended to be a miracle or turnkey solution that will eliminate hunger tomorrow, it is instead a process that will identify needs, define strategies and better guide the collective investments required to fight food insecurity.

The first phase of this initiative, the *Meta-Synthesis of Publications on Food Security in Montréal Since 2006*, was published on October 16, 2018 to coincide with World Food Day. The report, prepared by Récolte, describes the state of our knowledge of food security. It identifies aspects that have been studied, current knowledge gaps and less studied components.

In the next phase, group sessions were organized to capture tacit knowledge from stakeholders. Their challenges, conditions for success and dynamics that connect them enrich the ecosystem map, the first version of which will be unveiled in 2019.

The goal of this project, which was made possible thanks to support from the McConnell Foundation and the FGM's Fondation Paul A. Fournier and Fondation Gatién-Paquette funds, is to develop coordinated strategies for funding and action.

FOOD BANKS AND ORGANIZATIONS INVOLVED IN FOOD SECURITY

Food banks and various community organizations such as The Dépôt Community Food Center and Share the Warmth support the fight against hunger and work to ensure access to healthy food.

Moisson Montréal, Moisson Rive-Sud and Moisson Laurentides gather food donations and basic products all year long for distribution to community organizations. With a guaranteed food supply, these organizations can then focus on their activities in the community. In 2018, these food banks were supported primarily by the FGM's Malouf Family Fund, the Fonds Fondation Paul-A. Fournier and the Beatrice Enid Patterson Foundation Fund.

The first community food centre in Québec, **The Dépôt Community Food Center** is located in the Notre-Dame-de-Grâce neighbourhood. It is funded by the FGM's Community Initiatives Program, which awarded the centre \$15,000 in 2018, as well as by the FGM's Malouf Family Fund, Doggone Foundation Fund and Beatrice Enid Patterson Foundation Fund.

Also engaged in the fight against hunger, **Share the Warmth**, is a community organization in Pointe-Saint-Charles that helps Montrealers in need. Their priorities include food security for all, with a special focus on school-age children. This organization received a grant from the Malouf Family Fund in 2018.

THE LIGHTHOUSE CHILDREN AND FAMILIES

The **Lighthouse Children and Families** is Quebec's first pediatric palliative care hospice. For 20 years, the Lighthouse has been meeting the increasingly complex needs of families who have a child with a life-shortening disease. Today, the Lighthouse follows more than 300 families across Quebec. Offering respite services, symptoms management care, end of life care and then, bereavement support for the family, the Lighthouse's team of experienced professionals and devoted volunteers proposes a luminous environment where each child can have fun... to the very end.

In 2018, the organization received grants from the Fonds Fondation Famille Moreault, the Fonds Fondation Paul-A. Fournier and the Katharine Pearson Memorial Fund.

PREGNANT WOMEN'S DAY OFFERED BY DOCTORS OF THE WORLD

Doctors of the World is the last and only resort for people who do not have access to healthcare (migrants with precarious status) or who live on the margins of society (homeless, First Nations and Inuit individuals). Every Wednesday, the Doctors of the World Clinic is reserved for pregnant women and children. It offers them comprehensive support during and after their pregnancy, so long as their status remains precarious, and they do not have access to other care.

In 2018, FGM awarded the organization a \$25,000 grant to maintain the clinic's operation.

LOISIRS ADAPTÉS EN NATURE CAVALETTI

FGM supported **Loisirs adaptés en nature Cavaletti**, a program that offers adapted physical activities in a safe natural setting – including access to horses – to children aged 12 and under with autism spectrum disorder. The organization's approach aims to reduce stress through physical activity.

JE PASSE PARTOUT

Founded in 1988, **Je Passe Partout** is a community organization in the Hochelaga-Maisonneuve neighbourhood that works with nine elementary and secondary schools to encourage children to stay in school. Every year, the organization reaches more than 600 children and youths from disadvantaged backgrounds.

In 2018, FGM's Community Initiatives Program awarded a \$15,000 grant to support their project entitled *Le plaisir de la lecture chez les jeunes de 10 à 14 ans, c'est fantasTIC!* The funds were used to organize reading circles for small groups of children, exposing them to both print and electronic books. The children also participated in writing and media workshops using tablets to write stories, book reviews and trailers for their favourite book.

LITERACY FOUNDATION

Another organization that works towards quality education for all and promotes learning regardless of age, the **Literacy Foundation** focuses on the importance of lifelong literacy and helps improve the quality of life of individuals who are illiterate or poor readers. Its mission is to “support adults and children so they can develop their ability to read and write and participate fully in society.”

The Literacy Foundation has a fund at FGM and is supported by grants from other individual and family fund holders.

INNOVATION YOUTH

Since 2012, **Innovation Youth**, in the Peter-McGill neighbourhood, has developed expertise in urban agriculture and in helping youths and their families to access green spaces in the heart of the city. Supported by the FGM's Community Initiatives Program, their project *From Seed to City* seeks to provide youths with greater access to green spaces and community gardens, while allowing them to acquire work experience.

RADIO ARBRE

Radio Arbre was launched in March. A collaboration between FGM and Maison de l'innovation sociale, **Radio Arbre** is a community radio station that gives a voice to the children of Greater Montréal and invites them to share their vision for their neighbourhood. PEACE, JUSTICE AND STRONG INSTITUTIONS

Promote just, peaceful and inclusive societies

EQUITAS

Based in Montréal **Equitas** is Canada’s most recognized and active human rights education organization. It works for the advancement of equality, social justice and respect for human dignity through transformative education programs. Equitas gives people the tools to fight against inequality and discrimination and to work to build safer and more inclusive societies. In the last 50 years, Equitas has reached more than 4 million people worldwide.

In 2018, the organization received a \$16,000 grant from the May Kersten Social Justice Fund.

SOCIAL JUSTICE CONNECTION

Also working towards peace and advocating for human rights, **Social Justice Connection** seeks to engage citizens in working for a more socially just world. It does so through Educonnexion, “an educational program, increasingly focused on human rights-based responsible global citizenship” that brings together people who want to teach, learn and contribute to a connected and peaceful world.

Social Justice Connection was also supported by the May Kersten Social Justice Fund in 2018.

PRÉVENTION SUD-OUEST

At a more local level, **Prévention Sud-Ouest** launched a project titled *Griffintown, un développement sans violence*, which received a \$15,000 grant from the FGM’s 2018 Community Initiatives Program. The project was created in response to appeals from neighbourhood residents for help with youths engaging in vandalism, intimidation and loitering. Two coordinators were hired for the summer to engage youths in various activities and help them develop a sense of belonging to the neighbourhood.

MULTIPLE SDGs

While some organizations focus on a specific goal such as food security, health or school success, others tackle several issues at the same time.

EXEKO

Exeko is one such organization. Based in Montréal since 2006, it uses “creativity (art and philosophy) for the social inclusion of people who experience(d) or are at risk of exclusion.” Exeko uses both practical approaches of intellectual and cultural mediation, and systemic approaches inspired from social innovation to encourage intellectual emancipation, prevent exclusion (homelessness, crime, suicide, drug addiction), foster citizen and cultural participation and strengthen self identity.

For example, its idAction Mobile program is described as “a cultural and philosophical caravan that roams the streets of Montreal. On board is a library, magazines and art and writing materials that are used to initiate a conversation with citizens, particularly the homeless.”

Through its projects, Exeko focuses on such issues as the fight against poverty (SDG 1), mental health promotion (SDG 3) and the development of and access to the arts. In 2018, their *Métissages urbains jeunesse* project received a grant from the FGM’s Community Initiatives Program.

NATIVE WOMEN’S SHELTER OF MONTRÉAL

The **Native Women’s Shelter of Montréal** offers a safe and supportive environment that reinforces the cultural identity, self-esteem and independence of Indigenous women and their children living in Montréal. The organization provides an environment where its clientele can be heard and receive counselling and support on a variety of issues: access to housing, food, clothing, legal, medical and educational services, addiction, individual and group therapy on violence and sexual abuse, parenting skills development, and more.

In 2018, the organization received a grant from the LES Foundation Fund.

ALTERGO

AlterGo consists of 130 organizations working towards universal accessibility. It contributes to social development by supporting inclusion of people with functional limitations by removing barriers to recreation, sports and culture. It also raises awareness among organizations, elected officials and the general public about the needs of people with a functional limitation.

The organization received grants from the Fonds Fondation Paul-A. Fournier in 2018 and from the FGM’s Community Initiatives Program for the Mini-marathon project and for organizing the forum GO – Pour un Grand Montréal accessible held in February 2019. This event brought together stakeholders from the Greater Montréal area who are concerned about universal accessibility to sports, recreation and culture in order to set clear objectives to advance universal accessibility in the metropolitan region.

MULTIPLE SDGs

GRANDIR AVEC LA VILLE (2018-2024)

On November 20, Universal Children's Day, the Foundation of Greater Montréal announced that it was funding the study *Grandir avec la ville (2018-2024) : une étude longitudinale sur le quotidien des enfants du Grand Montréal*.

Conducted by researchers Juan Torres and Natasha Blanchet-Cohen, respectively of Université de Montréal and Concordia University, this study seeks to understand how the living environment affects children as they enter adolescence. This action research project will follow 150 students from different neighbourhoods for six years, from grade 6 to grade 11, in order to deepen understanding of their everyday lives, ambitions and sense of belonging to their community.

VITAL SIGNS

The inaugural meeting of the Vital Signs strategic committee was held in November. Tasked with guiding the work of the next *Vital Signs of Greater Montréal* report, this committee brings together nearly 30 local organizations, including partners from various levels of government, parapublic organizations, philanthropic funders and community organizations from various fields.

WELCOME FUND FOR SYRIAN REFUGEES

The special fund created by the Community Foundations of Canada in 2015 allowed FGM to continue to support the Greater Montréal community in welcoming Syrian refugees. In 2018, **\$163,584** was distributed to four organizations to support their efforts in helping these newcomers integrate into Canadian society.

FGM also continued funding **Hay Doun's** psychosocial support project for Syrian refugees and their families.

Action Réfugiés Montréal received a grant for its social integration program for men. According to the organization, many male refugees feel isolated, which affects their integration and mental health. Action Réfugiés Montréal breaks this isolation by organizing discussion and information meetings (law, finance, job market), community meals and activities suggested by the participants.

The **Centre social d'aide aux immigrants (CSAI)** is dedicated to welcoming government-assisted immigrants and refugees. In 2018, the FGM's \$55,245 grant enabled the CSAI to continue its school support program for young Syrian refugees. Children receive help with schoolwork while parents receive support in understanding their children's educational experience and to communicate with schools and community service providers.

The **Montréal City Mission's Camp Cosmos** gives Syrian and other newly arrived refugee children the opportunity to go to summer camp. Besides bringing much needed fun, the camp helps the youngsters improve their English and French skills and eases their transition to life in Canada.

ARTS AND CULTURE

LA CLASSE ENCHANTÉE

Developed by the École des jeunes of Université de Montréal's Faculty of Music, in collaboration with the Commission scolaire de Montréal, **La classe enchantée** is an educational project designed to make music accessible to as many children as possible regardless of their family's socioeconomic status. This extracurricular activity is a concrete way of giving more children the opportunity to learn to play a musical instrument. Not only does it allow elementary school children to discover the joys of learning music, it fosters greater self-esteem, respect and academic engagement, and gives them the tools to continue studying music if they so wish.

Although this initiative was spearheaded by UdeM's Faculty of Music, École des jeunes receives no funding from the university or the government. Its activities are self-financed through contributions from its clientele and, especially, donations.

In 2018, the Fonds Josée et Michel Jacques awarded a \$25,000 grant to La classe enchantée.

CAMP MUSICAL PÈRE LINDSAY

Founded in 1967, **Camp musical Père Lindsay** in Lanaudière hosts more than 540 boys and girls aged 8 to 16 for eight weeks in the summer. During this time, the young musicians study music intensively in a safe, outdoor setting, under the supervision of teachers and counsellors. Their stay is an opportunity to expose youth to music and the world around them through group activities such as choral singing, creative workshops, theatre, dance, guided musical listening and orchestra.

In 2018, Camp musical Père Lindsay received a \$20,000 grant from the Fonds Germaine Gibara.

KAHNAWAKE COMMUNITY RADIO SHOW

The **Kanien'kehá:ka Onkwawén:na Raotitíhkwa Language and Cultural Center** works to preserve and promote the language and culture of the Mohawks of Kahnawake. Their radio program, also available on SoundCloud, is a popular and important medium for carrying out their mission.

FGM supported the centre's shows with a \$20,000 grant at the end of 2018.

ADMINISTRATION

REPORT FROM THE AUDIT COMMITTEE


The Audit Committee is made up of six people: four Board members and two outside members.

The Committee met five times in 2018 to monitor the quarterly and annual financial results of FGM and FGMIF (including budgeting process and ongoing review), and to advance various files: insurance for FGM, selection of a trustee for the FGMIF, development and implementation of a business continuity plan, evaluation of the online donation and accounting software projects, IT security, and risk management.

FGM posted excellent financial results in 2018, exceeding targets and generating an excess of revenue over expenses of \$23 million despite poor market performance in the fourth quarter. As a result of the contributions received, FGM's investments rose from \$167.7 million to \$190.7 million during the year ended December 31, 2018. When the investments managed on behalf of other organizations are factored in FGM had \$308 million in managed funds as at December 31, 2018, an increase of almost \$16 million over the previous year. Thanks to donor confidence and contributions from government programs, total contributions to FGM reached almost \$40.6 million in 2018.

FGM'S NATIONAL PHILANTHROPY DAY

Close to 200 participants gathered at the Gesù on November 14 for a panel discussion and networking event to celebrate FGM's National Philanthropy Day. Titled "Quelles tendances à surveiller en philanthropie?", the panel was moderated by Karen Macdonald, a member of FGM's Board and News Director and Station Manager at Global TV Montréal. The panelists – Lili-Anna Pereša of Centraide of Greater Montreal, Hilary Pearson of PFC and Jean-Marc Fontan of PhilLab – had a frank discussion on important philanthropic issues.

NEW ÉTUDE SUR LES TENDANCES EN PHILANTHROPIE AU QUÉBEC

A reference in the field, this study coordinated by the firm Épisode measures generosity over the years and provides invaluable data on the state of charitable donations in the country and philanthropy trends in Québec. This sixth edition was made possible by a partnership between Épisode, National Bank, Foundation of Greater Montréal and Léger. Thanks to this alliance, the study is available free of charge for the first time. The study was launched on November 6 at the Musée des beaux-arts during an event hosted by FGM President and CEO Yvan Gauthier.

MONTRÉAL RELÈVE INTERNS

In August, FGM welcomed eight young interns as part of Montréal Rélève's Student Business program. Among other things, they visited an organization, conducted a simulated search for funding and presented a fictitious community project.

YOUTH AND PHILANTHROPY INITIATIVE CANADA

In 2018, FGM supported the project to translate Youth and Philanthropy Initiative Canada's resource guide for teachers and students into French. The organization raises awareness about philanthropy through a competition where groups of high-school students give a presentation on a charity and attempt to convince a student jury on the relevance of supporting their chosen cause. Students who give the winning presentation receive a \$5,000 grant for their chosen charitable organization. Translation of the resource guide will help mobilize more youths in Greater Montréal's French schools, educate them about local social issues and instill a sense of civic engagement.

SIXTH EDITION OF THE RENCONTRES PHILANTHROPIQUES OF THE ASSOCIATION DES PROFESSIONNELS EN GESTION PHILANTHROPIQUE (APGP)

FGM was the official partner of the sixth edition of the Rencontres philanthropiques hosted by the APGP in Montréal. Recent studies conducted by Épisode, Imagine Canada and the Institut Mallet on women and philanthropy were presented at the meeting, where the attendees discussed the philanthropy situation in Québec and Canada, and the growing presence of women in this field.

NORTH-AMERICAN COMMUNITY FOUNDATIONS SUMMIT

In February, FGM attended the first-ever North American Community Foundations Summit, a joint initiative by Canada, Mexico and the U.S. Representatives of 120 community foundations gathered in Mexico to explore how their respective foundations are working at the local and global level to achieve the 17 Sustainable Development Goals. FGM President and CEO Yvan Gauthier was part of the panel discussion entitled "Migration, immigration, multiculturalism and nativism: defining 'we' in North America".

EVALUATION OF THE ROLE AND ACTIONS OF FOUNDATIONS IN RESPONSE TO SOCIAL INEQUALITIES AND ENVIRONMENTAL CHALLENGES

FGM joined other Canadian philanthropic organizations to support a research project titled *Évaluation du rôle et des actions des fondations subventionnaires canadiennes en réponse à l'enjeu des inégalités sociales et des défis environnementaux*. This research partnership brings together some 50 professors and students from various universities and about 30 philanthropic partners. This is the first major collaborative effort in Québec and Canada between the academic and philanthropic communities.

COMMUNICATIONS

Communication activities

FGM IN THE MEDIA

In 2018, FGM was the subject of several articles and mentions online on La Presse+, ICI Radio Canada and Child in the City, as well as in the *Métro* newspaper and the *La Scena Musicale* magazine. FGM President and CEO Yvan Gauthier was also among the invited guests to the round table themed "La philanthropie à Montréal," on the *Mise à jour Montréal* show, which aired on MAtv on November 6.

Ads and sponsored articles were also featured in the magazine *Les Affaires*, online on Presse+, on the radio station Radio Classique, in local North and South Shore newspapers and on the classical music site Ludwig van Montréal.

PUBLICATIONS

In 2018, FGM published the *Meta-Synthesis of Publications on Food Security in Montréal Since 2006*, two brochures (its strategic plan and an information document for philanthropists), its annual report and a document on the Zero Hunger in Montréal project.



WEBSITE

The 2017 *Vital Signs – Greater Montréal's Children* report was posted on www.signesvitaux.ca, a new site launched in the spring.

FGM is in the process of redesigning its main site www.fgmmtl.org. Although the number of visitors declined (-28% from 2017), the number of pages consulted increased (+58%).

VIDEOS

During the year, eight videos on projects supported by FGM's Community Initiatives Program were produced in which the grant recipients presented their mission and the funded project. A video was also created for Vital Signs 2017 and activities related to this initiative.

SOCIAL MEDIA

FGM is active on four social media platforms: Facebook, Twitter, LinkedIn and YouTube. These are increasingly followed; both the number of followers and impressions increased for each platform in 2018. FGM posted an average of 110 times on each account during the year.
