A word from the Board Chair and the President and CEO

Can you believe it's been 20 years?

2019 marked the end of the first cycle of the Foundation's existence. And look at the results!

Back in 2000, who could have predicted that the Foundation would grow so quickly, except perhaps the group of pioneers who put their faith behind the idea that Greater Montréal needed a community foundation of the kind that had existed across Canada since 1921? 2000 was, in several ways, a crucial year for philanthropy in Montréal. It was then that two major family foundations, the André and Lucie Chagnon Foundation and the Trottier Family Foundation, were created. Starting up a foundation like FGM without a sizeable initial endowment was a risky endeavour: it could only grow its assets through the creation of funds by individuals and organizations who were willing to put their trust into this fledgling project.

Twenty years later, FGM has become a well-established institution in the philanthropic landscape. It has proven those pioneers right: they were correct in thinking that this kind of inclusive foundation, open to all causes, accessible to any citizen or organization, was a must for Greater Montréal. FGM's results demonstrate clearly that the risk they took paid off: the Foundation's assets grew at a rapid, even exceptional rate in just 20 years. The total assets held by FGM and its investment fund have now surpassed the \$345M mark. Over the last four years, the annual average amount donated to FGM has been more than \$38M. In a foundation like ours, returns generated by the investment of assets also help make the assets grow. In 2019, our gross rate of return was 14.2%, and over the last 10 years, the average rate of return reached 7.6%. Another highlight from last year: the amount given out in grants went over the \$12M mark. Throughout the years, more than 1,200 charitable organizations have benefited

from FGM's support.

Beyond these numbers, there are literally hundreds of wonderful stories to tell, testimonies to the generosity and commitment of our donors to the community; without this generosity, FGM would simply not exist. There are, of course, beautiful stories about individual donors, but a sizeable share of the funds created back at the beginnings of FGM originated in the non-profit sector, for example the Centraide funds and the YMCA funds. Over time, more than 150 organizations, many from the cultural but also from the education and sports sectors, have created funds with FGM, thanks to government programs that encourage philanthropy, and private initiatives like Mécénat Musica. Overall, FGM manages just about 645 funds, of all sizes and from all sectors.

As a community, we can be proud of the fact that Greater Montréal has joined the ranks of other major Canadian cities in a network of community foundations that collectively manages nearly \$6 billion through its 191 currently active foundations!

These successes in philanthropic development also bring with them obligations: our organization is taking on the challenge of creating for itself a long-term vision and projects that will fight against the inequalities that harm the disadvantaged in our communities, and ensure a sustainable future. That is why our 2018 Strategic Plan adopted the United Nations' Sustainable Development Goals as its core orientation.

Three flagship projects demonstrate FGM's commitment on this front.

The Vital Signs® of Greater Montréal report is certainly the most well-known symbol of this ongoing contribution by FGM.

Then, there is the ambitious Zero Hunger in Montréal project, which not only resulted in the first major overview of this ecosystem, but also mobilized community actors to build up major projects, working in a concerted manner.

Another flagship initiative is our commitment to the Collective Impact Project, steered by Centraide, as we fight poverty along with eight other foundations that have invested time and money in projects in 17 neighbourhoods across Montréal. Apart from these three flagship projects, we should also mention our assistance to Syrian refugees in 2016, and in a more direct way, our current support for gender equality and our alliance with Community Foundations of Canada and the Chantier de l'économie sociale, in developing strategic projects aimed at bolstering investment in the social economy in Greater Montréal.

Our goal is to build the Greater Montréal of tomorrow, a Greater Montréal driven by the Sustainable Development Goals. We are focusing on the year 2030 as our next horizon, and we will continue to innovate so as to further bring the vision and mission of the Foundation to life. We are also going to continue to develop quality services and tools in order to democratize philanthropy throughout the community, using the most appropriate technologies. We are also going to be actors on the key issues, working to improve the well-being of the population of Greater Montréal area, based on the indicators that will be highlighted in the next edition of the Vital Signs®.

These are just a few of the advances that have come out of 20 years of relentless effort, initiated by the pioneers who began this foundation. We are certain that those who will shape the next 20 years will be just as relentless!

2019 Highlights



JANUARY

Participation in the Collective Impact Project (CIP)

In 2019, total investments from CIP partners, who are collaborating with Centraide of Greater Montréal, reached \$8 million, distributed among the Montreal neighbourhoods participating in this program. CIP is an initiative that fights poverty and exclusion in 17 Montréal neighbourhoods.



FEBRUARY

Community Engagement

In 2019, as part of its Community Initiatives Program, the Foundation contributed \$640,000 to 47 charitable organizations, in all sectors of activity and across Greater Montréal. In order to qualify for support, the projects had to be pursuing at least one Sustainable Development Goal, in particular Zero Hunger, Quality Education, Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions or Good Health and Well-Being.

The FGM has also, through its major and strategic projects, supported several organizations including the social perinatal organization La Maison Bleue, which offers social perinatal care – and which the Foundation had assisted in the past, right back to its beginnings – in opening a fourth establishment in the borough of Verdun.

Moving Forward with the Zero Hunger in Montréal Initiative

FGM and its partners published reports on phases 2 and 3 of the project, which continues to mobilize actors in the city's food security ecosystem. The phase 2 report, which included a conceptual mapping of that ecosystem, was unveiled in connection with the SAM (Système Alimentaire Montréalais) Forum of the Conseil du système alimentaire montréalais.

As well, FGM invested in major food security projects, like La Cantine pour tous, and offered substantial funding to Moisson Montréal, Moisson Laval and Moisson Rive-Sud to support their mission.



NOVEMBER

Creation of FGM's Jean E. Douville Bursaries

Made possible by an extraordinary gift, these bursaries amounting to \$60,000 per year will be awarded – in perpetuity – to students in finance and in mental health research at four major Montréal universities: Concordia, HEC Montréal, McGill and Université de Montréal.



Philanthropy Day 2019

The Foundation held the seventh edition of its celebration of National Philanthropy Day. The event featured a panel that discussed the role of foundations as community actors in the twenty-first century. Following the event, which was attended by nearly 300 people, a networking cocktail brought together several actors from the Montréal philanthropic and non-profit sectors.



MAY

Work Begins on Vital Signs® of Greater Montréal, the 2020 edition

The Foundation mandated the Institut du Québec to compile and analyze the best data available to paint a portrait of the evolution of the metropolitan region since the turn of the millennium. The Vital Signs® strategic committee met several times to steer and finetune work on the project.



SEPTEMBER

Mécénat Musica Gala

Mécénat Musica encourages individual donors and donating families to make a gift in perpetuity to a cultural organization they care about, by arranging for the matching of their gifts. 2019 was the fifth year for the program.

Participation in the Community Foundations of Canada Conference

Among the many interesting themes considered by conference attendees in Victoria, especially worth noting were discussions about impact investing by community foundation investment funds in Canada and the role of philanthropy in reconciliation with First Nations.



SEPTEMBER

Louise Penny Creates the Three Pines Foundation Fund

The renowned novelist created this multisectoral fund over the summer. She plans on transferring a portion of her book royalties to the fund to support causes like literacy, animal welfare, and aid for caregivers.



Announcement of Projects FGM is Backing in the RBC Future Launch Community Challenge

In addition to an initiative that aims to promote the protection of the environment through the creation and dissemination of art, FGM has also chosen to back two projects that will work for the enhancement and transmission of indigenous cultural practices in Kanesatake and Kahnawake.

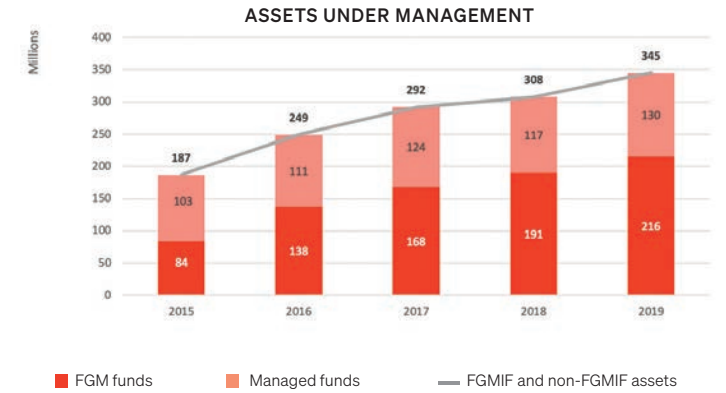

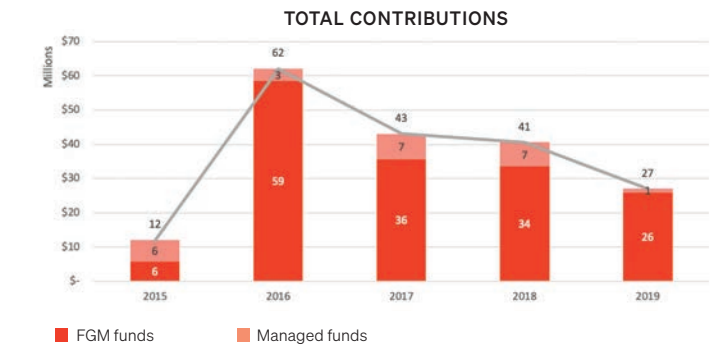


FGM assets exceed \$345 million

The Foundation of Greater Montreal soared to new heights in 2019. Assets under management surpassed \$345 million in 2019, reaching \$345,414,430 at year-end, according to the financial results for the year concluded December 31, 2019.

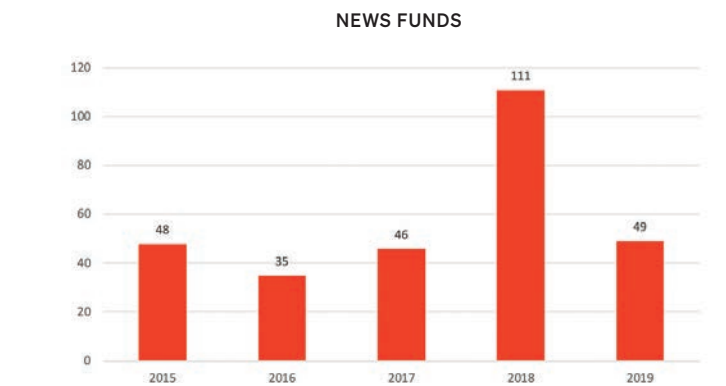


Close to \$185 million in donations and contributions in the past five years

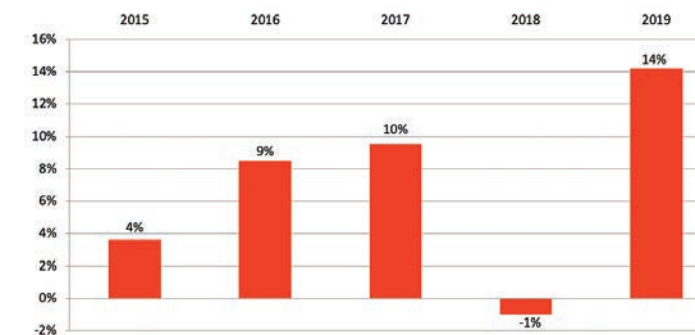

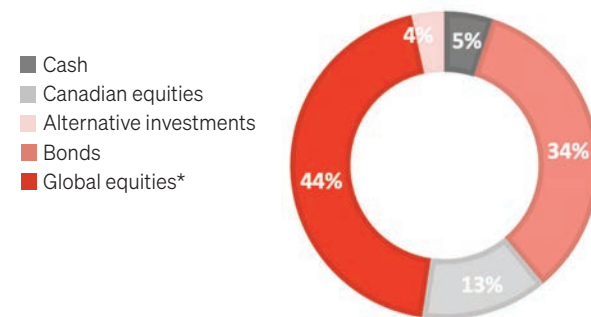
A outstanding gross return of 14.2% in 2019

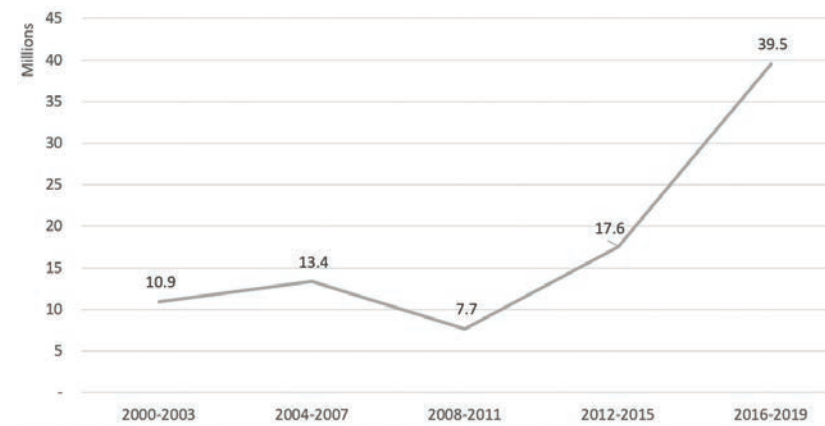
FGMIF RETURN OVER FIVE YEARS



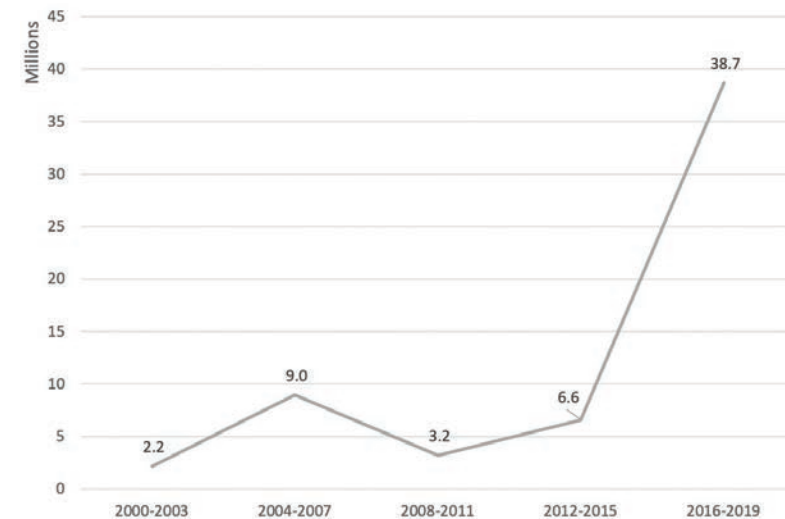
FGMIF ASSET ALLOCATION AS AT DECEMBER 31, 2019

The advantages of the FGMIF

The FGM Investment Fund (FGMIF) was created in 2004 to grow the funds' assets through a pooled investment strategy and protect fundraisers by creating a separate and unique identity for managing their money. The FGMIF's orientations are based on the FGM's investment policy and its legal framework is subject to the Autorité des marchés financiers (AMF). The FGMIF manager must comply with AMF rules and is accountable to fund holders (financial statements, portfolio performance, etc.). Governance of the FGMIF is subject to the rules and oversight of the FGM Board of Directors and its Investment Committee.

Direct Access To Fund Statements

With Access Funds, fund holders can track their fund's performance online, where they can view all statements, administrative transactions and grants to charitable organizations.

Report From The Investment Committee

The assets of the Foundation of Greater Montréal Investment Fund (FGMIF) reached \$306.4 million as of December 31 2019, an increase of \$43.9 million over the previous year. This increase stems from net investment income of \$9.9 million, net contributions of \$8.2 million (gross contributions of \$23.6 million and withdrawals of \$15.4 million) and an unrealized change in fair value of investments of \$25.8 million. FGMIF's return on investment for 2019 was 14.2%, whereas the average for the last five years was 6.9%. Among the FGMIF's investments, actively managed funds generally outperformed their benchmark indices, while indexed funds performed at the same level as their benchmark indices. Fixed income holdings and real estate also added to the value of our portfolio. When we add FGM assets managed

outside of the FGMIF, total assets reach \$345.4 million.

FGMIF continued to focus on its goal of generating the returns needed to ensure philanthropic distributions, while also covering the expenses required for sound management, and ensuring that the purchasing power of FGM's capital is at least partially maintained.

Over the course of 2019, as well as ensuring the application and the proper evolution of its investment policy, the committee examined the issue of impact investment (its definition, what holdings are on offer in this sector, the capacity to integrate them into the investment fund, the appropriateness of such investments, etc.). It also met with the main portfolio managers of the investment

fund, evaluated its external investments manager, and recommended to the Board of Directors an appropriate payout rate (the highest in its history) based on 2019 performance but also on reserves accumulated over the last few years. The Board endorsed this recommendation at its November 27, 2019 meeting.

I would like to thank all the members who actively participated in the work of our committee, which met five times in 2019.

Established in perpetuity, the Jean E. Douville Bursaries will support 10 students, across all four major Montréal institutions of higher education. Each year, nine \$5,000 scholarships will be awarded to three finance students from Concordia University, HEC Montréal and McGill University. Furthermore, a \$15,000 scholarship will be awarded to a student-researcher in mental health at the École de santé publique de l'Université de Montréal.

Having both reaped the benefits of sound advice and guidance when contemplating careers that we hoped would prove to be successful, we expressed our gratitude through donations to our training institutions.

These donations ushered in a culture of philanthropy that we hope to pass on to our children and our descendants. Three Pines exists in our hearts. When we choose decency over cruelty. Kindness over cynicism. It is a place, in the words of the poet Auden, where goodness exists.

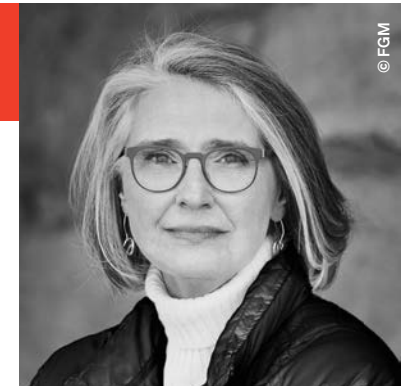
You have found Three Pines, and are now a villager. Thank you, and welcome!

Philanthropy Incentive Programs

In order to fulfill its role of promoting philanthropic culture throughout Greater Montréal, FGM has partnered with several philanthropy incentive programs.

In fields such as culture, sports, or education: Registered charities can create a fund at FGM and submit grant applications to various programs so as to match their fundraising efforts. Thanks to these contributions, they can sustain and develop their activities.

Mécénat Musica Program

Mécénat Musica is a cultural program created by donors for donors, back in 2013. It encourages individuals to make an in-perpetuity donation of \$25,000 to a cultural organization that is important to them, and it encourages philanthropic families to match these individuals' donations with donations of \$250,000 or \$2,500,000. This represents a significant shift in cultural philanthropy.

In 2019, five new organizations joined the program, bringing the total to 29 organizations as at December 31, 2019. Throughout 2019, a total of \$2,216,071 (excluding government matching grants) were deposited in the funds of FGM's participating organizations.

Mécénat Placements Culture Program

This program aims to ensure the financial independence and security of non-profit organizations in the fields of culture and communication by fostering the creation of permanent funds and encouraging fundraising initiatives by cultural organizations by offering a match to these collected funds. The program has been subject to new rules since July 2018.

There were 369 funds at FGM under this program, for a total value of \$129,073,934 as at December 31, 2019. This past year, 22 new funds were created.

In 2019, the Québec government contributed \$1,224,000 in matching grants to the funds of participating organizations.

Canadian Heritage Program

The Endowment Incentives component of the Canada Cultural Investment Fund encourages arts organizations to build new revenue streams. The federal government provides a funding incentive which supplements any donations collected by the organizations.

Since this component's creation in 2011, FGM has received \$11,815,623 in grants. As such, it is required to secure an equivalent amount from the private sector, for a minimum amount of \$28,143,057. This amount is to be held in perpetuity in FGM's restricted assets for the benefit of 36 associated professional non-profit artistic organizations, who are assisted by revenues generated through the Foundation's investment.

In 2019, FGM managed a total of 58 funds under this program, nine of which were created in the past 12 months. The government of Canada provided \$2,653,699 in matching grants to the funds of FGM's participating organizations in 2019.

Placement Réussite Program

Created in 2017, this Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur program focuses on organizations supporting initiatives that help kids stay in school and foster educational success.

As at December 31, 2019, seven funds remained at FGM, with \$770,853 in total assets.

In 2019, the Québec government contributed \$2,643,340 in matching grants to the funds of FGM's participating organizations.



Je Passe Partout was lucky enough to benefit from the Foundation of Greater Montréal's Placement Réussite Program. Thanks to this financial support, we further developed our academic support and family intervention services in 2018-2019. We reached a record number of children, parents and families. In fact, close to 1,500 children—aged 3 to 16—as well as their parents were able to benefit from our services at school or at home, from Monday to Thursday, from October to May. Another small step toward the educational success of Greater Montréal's younger citizens!

Thanks to the Foundation of Greater Montréal and the grant matching programs, Québec's Mécénat Placements Culture, the Canada Cultural Investment Fund as well as Mécénat Musica, Aramusique (Association de Repentigny pour l'avancement de la musique), a small organization with big dreams, was able to convince major donors to help establish its very first endowment fund. With Mécénat Musica's support, Aramusique was also able to award pianist Jean-Michel Dubé, First Prize winner of the Hélène-Roberge Competition, an Excellence Grant.

Revenues generated by this endowment fund will allow Aramusique to continue its mission of making high-quality musical activities available to the largest possible number of people and introducing younger audiences to music.

The Placements Sports Program has had a considerable impact on the growth and autonomy of Waterpolo Québec. Not only has the leveraging effect of this grant matching helped provide for two permanent full-time positions in the past five years, it also helped improve our strategies for carrying out our mission, namely to promote the discipline to more people across Québec, by investing both money and efforts in regional programs fostering the discovery, introduction to and development of our sport.

Placements Sports Program

Placements Sports, a Ministère de l'Éducation et de l'Enseignement supérieur program, aims to help sports federations generate new sources of revenue through fundraising campaigns. Administered by Corporation Sports-Québec, this program also involves the creation of an endowment fund to ensure the organizations' long-term sustainability.

In 2019, FGM managed a total of \$7,993,309 through 61 funds under this program. By year's end, \$1,068,376 had been paid out to the funds of FGM's participating sports federations.

Our Commitment To The Sustainable Development Goals

“The Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) agreed by the international community in 2015 represent an ambitious effort to set a global agenda for development that is both equitable and sustainable, in social, economic and environmental terms.”¹

In 2017, inspired by UNICEF’s Innocenti Report Card 14, FGM used 10 of the 17 SDGs to paint a picture of the overall well-being of Greater Montréal’s children. The Vital Signs® report compared their situation to that of children in Canada, Québec and other administrative regions. The findings for some indicators were alarming, particularly those concerning poverty and food insecurity.

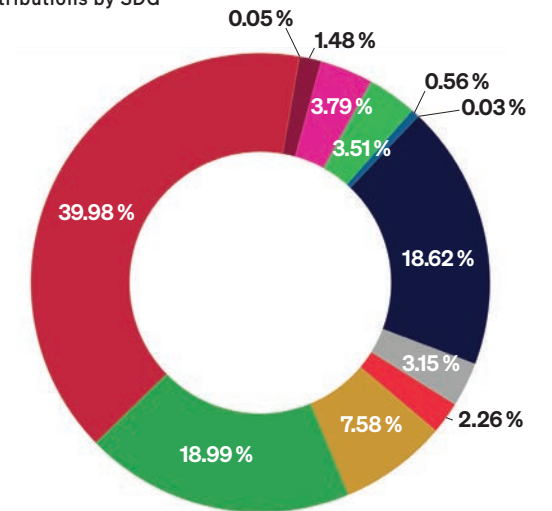
A pioneer in Québec in measuring the health of its population through a sustainable development lens, FGM added a new facet to its work for the well-being of the community by applying this framework to its projects as of 2018. Taking into account the issues brought to light by the Vital Signs® report, it adapted its grant making Community Initiatives Program to the SDGs structure. It also participates in the Collective Impact Project (CIP) to reduce the impact of poverty. The Zero Hunger in Montréal initiative, launched in 2018, reflects the desire to respond locally to these global concerns in order to build a more sustainable and equitable community.

FGM now aligns all its activities and grant making with the SDGs. To this end, it has identified the major issues on which it intends to focus:

- + SDG 1 — No Poverty;
- + SDG 2 — Zero Hunger;
- + SDG 3 — Good Health and Well-being;
- + SDG 4 — Quality Education;
- + SDG 10 — Reduced inequalities;
- + SDG 11 — Sustainable Cities and Communities;
- + SDG 16 — Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions.

More than \$12.7 M distributed to meet the SDGs

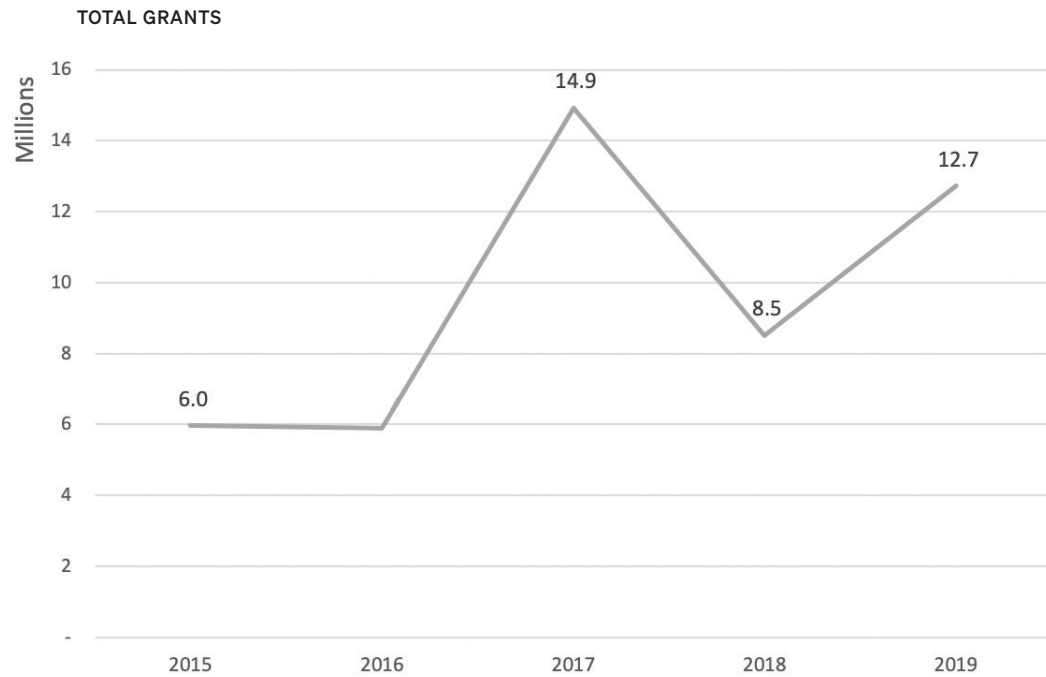
2019 Distributions by SDG

Report of the Community Engagement Committee

In 2019, FGM granted more than \$12.7 million to 491 organizations. We helped meaningful projects advance and made grants in support of priorities aligned with the SDGs. These included close to \$1 million towards projects related to Zero Hunger (SDG 2), almost \$2.5 million to Good Health and Well-Being (SDG 3), and more than \$5 million to Quality Education (SDG 4), as well as almost \$2.5 million in support of Arts and Culture in Greater Montréal.

As we ramped up to FGM's 20th anniversary, we thought long and hard about the role of the Committee and the effectiveness of FGM's existing granting models in light of its mission and vision. We are still deep into this work, which took up a good part of the six meetings the Committee held in 2019. Stay tuned to see where we land in 2020. I have no doubt our future directions will continue to ensure FGM's unique multi-sector approach, its timely response to both urgent and pressing needs and its ability to bring together stakeholders across ecosystems.

In 2019, the Community Engagement Committee also piloted the Community Initiatives Program, through which it supported 47 projects targeting the well-being of children, for a total of \$638,585 in grants. These projects were aligned with five SDGs, namely Zero Hunger (SDG 2), Good Health and Well-Being (SDG 3), Quality Education (SDG 4), Sustainable Cities and Communities (SDG 11) and Peace, Justice and Strong Institutions (SDG 16). Moving forward, modifications to decision making around granting will allow the committee to have more time to consider the broader scope of FGM's interventions in the community at a strategic level, while ensuring rigour and accountability.

The Community Engagement Committee membership changed this year, and while we lost some great members for personal and professional reasons, we also gained significant expertise on the committee, with the addition (in alphabetical order) of Andrea Clarke, Pascal Grenier, Grace Laing Hogg and Malvina Klag. Together with current members Art Campbell, Juniper Glass and Danielle Sauvage, as well as myself, our committee now has a breadth of knowledge and know-how in cutting-edge philanthropy, community development, social innovation, project evaluation, and strategic planning, to name just a few areas of expertise and perspective. Thank you to all members for their work and their commitment.

No Poverty

End poverty in all its forms everywhere

The Collective Impact Project

One goal brings us together-- in this area: reduce poverty by supporting strategies developed and implemented by citizens and partners across 17 Montréal neighbourhoods. In Year 3 of the project's implementation, local actors had this to say: "The Collective Impact Project's strength, through its major philanthropic partners, its skilled operator and the significant financial leverage it provides, breathes new life into local engagement. Local actors can maintain their commitments, regardless (...) of the challenges

they face." Myriam Bérubé, Director – Experimental projects and learning, Centraide of Greater Montreal.

Alongside the project operator, namely Centraide of Greater Montreal, FGM and eight other major foundations as well as three strategic partners have committed \$23 million over five years to support this strategic initiative that provides support that is tailor-made to each neighbourhood's reality.



“After three years of implementation, we are now seeing a community of stakeholders who are committed to collective impact and who share a common vision and language. (...) The collective impact approach's rationale is that large-scale social change can only occur through the collaboration of stakeholders from different sectors. This past year, the commitment of neighbourhood leaders and organizations and the development of their capacity to engage partners from different backgrounds were major assets. These multi-sector collaborations also came about

through many innovative projects taking concrete action on the change targets identified in the neighbourhoods. Despite the inherent difficulty of deploying a collective impact initiative, all of these findings show that significant progress was made this past year.”

Zero Hunger

End hunger and achieve food security and improved nutrition

Fighting hunger and food insecurity is a concern for a great number of organizations, foundations and donors. As such, a total amount of \$964,096 in grants was allotted to this worthy cause in 2019, in addition to \$147,507 which was invested in the Zero Hunger in Montréal initiative. The goal of this initiative is to better understand the collective response to food insecurity implemented in the Montréal area so as to provide some guidance for future investments, and thus make them more effective.

The Zero Hunger in Montréal initiative

This project was launched in 2018 following the publication of the 2017 edition of Vital Signs® of Greater Montréal, which stressed the urgency of the issue of hunger in Montréal, where 11% of households experience food insecurity.

In response to this situation, FGM decided to launch a project to better understand the collective response deployed in Montréal to tackle food insecurity. To begin with, FGM set up a committee—with government, philanthropic and community partners—to oversee this initiative, then recruited a team of consultants to lead research and mobilization projects in relation to Montréal's food insecurity ecosystem.

Following the first phase, which led to the publication in October 2018 of the

Meta-synthesis of publications on food security in Montréal since 2006, the Zero Hunger initiative really took off in 2019 with Phases 2 and 3.

Three rounds of data collection—a survey, group sessions and interviews—done earlier in the year and involving about 100 organizations (community, private, public, social economy and philanthropic) helped identify actors in the food security ecosystem, their functions as well as the barriers and levers that influence their activities. All this information, organized using concept maps, can be found in the Portrait de l'écosystème montréalais de la sécurité alimentaire, published in May 2019. Three issues were identified as priorities by initiative participants: the supply chain, organizations' financial health and coordinated action.

The project's third phase began with particular emphasis on optimizing the supply chain, a cross-sectional issue that covers factors impacting organizations' financial health as well as coordinated action. The publication of a working document, covering past and current solutions and what needs to be addressed to make the supply chain as effective as possible, served as a foundation for consultations involving some 40 organizations in November 2019 and January 2020. This document is entitled Pour un réseau d'approvisionnement de la sécurité alimentaire plus stratégique à Montréal (published in December 2019).

Organization: La Cantine pour tous

This initiative is a school meal program designed to provide all children in participating schools the opportunity to enjoy a healthy and affordable lunch.

The pilot project, La Cantine pour tous dans les écoles, aims to demonstrate the relevance of implementing a school meal program available to all in Québec schools. The objective is to give, for the very first time, every child in participating institutions the opportunity to enjoy a healthy and affordable lunch. The meals' production costs will be financed by a special fund of donations and grants solicited by La Cantine pour tous, and by parents, whose contribution is based on their means. Meals are prepared and delivered by certified caterers who are members of La Cantine pour tous.

FGM granted \$40,000 from our major and strategic projects, in addition to a \$60,000 contribution from the Fonds Paul A. Fournier and the Fonds Gatien Paquette.

Organization: The four "Moisson"

(Moisson Montréal, Moisson Laval et Moisson Rive-Sud)

FGM contributed \$150,000 toward building a freezer setup which will be shared by the three Moissons. All Greater Montréal stakeholders will reap the benefits of pooling resources.

This installation helps reduce waste and promote healthy eating habits for nearly 190,000 people through 420 organizations in Greater Montreal, which receive food through the Moissons each month.

Moisson Laurentides: Support of \$ 33,333 in 2019 with a 3-year commitment for a total of \$100,000.

The organization plans to relocate its facilities to a new building that will double the current area from 10,000 square feet to 20,954 square feet.



Good Health and Well-Being

Ensure healthy lives and promote well-being for all at all ages

Organization: Les Scientifines

Project: Être une ado bien dans sa peau... et sa tête!

Les Scientifines are looking to implement the following project: "Être une ado bien dans sa peau... et sa tête!" This initiative aims to provide some 30 girls aged 12 to 17 from multi-ethnic and disadvantaged neighbourhoods with some 15 discussion workshops around themes related to well-being and mental health, as suggested by the teens themselves. These workshops took place in the spring of 2019, over a three-month period, in late afternoons on Mondays and Fridays, in the Scientifines offices. The main objective is to create an open and bias-free environment, a safe space where teenage girls can share and feel accepted, are part of a group and are given access to information and tools provided by guest speakers sharing their expertise on issues teenagers are interested in. Participants can then put these tricks and tips into practice in their daily lives, when things get stressful or uncomfortable. This project will contribute to the participants' emotional and physical well-being.



Organization: La Maison Bleue

A model organization in social innovation in the field of perinatal care, La Maison Bleue has developed its capacity to reach and support families living in a context of vulnerability, beginning at pregnancy, so as to have a substantiated positive impact on toddlers' health and development. The benefits of this model on a human scale are still very much in demand, as proven by the opening of a fourth Maison Bleue in Verdun, in southwestern Montréal. FGM, which supported La Maison Bleue in its early days and when it opened its third Maison in the Saint-Michel neighbourhood in 2017, wanted to contribute once again to help establish this fourth resource.

Quality Education

Ensure inclusive and equitable quality education and promote lifelong learning opportunities for all

Organization: Ali et les Princes de la Rue Project: Dropout prevention

Thanks to the school permit issued by Québec's Ministère de l'éducation et de l'enseignement supérieur in 2017, the project can develop a training program for each teenager and provide a recognized school program from Secondary 1 to Secondary 5, including one-to-one teaching. Math, French, History and Science classes are offered from Monday through Friday, from 9 a.m. to 3:30 p.m. The project helps students aged 6 to 11 with their school work, thanks to activities such as homework support, remedial work and exam preparation. School support is offered from Monday to Thursday, from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. Ali et les Princes de la Rue has been officially recognized by the Ministry as an organization committed to dropout prevention since 2016. Mentoring through martial arts is a means of integrating kids into the organization's programs. This gets the body moving through physical exercise, which is combined with martial arts teachings that incorporate a philosophical dimension and values of peace, introducing moments of reflection and dialogue throughout the courses to address various issues such as self-control and self-discipline.

Organization: Créations Etc... Project: Projet Rousselot

Projet Rousselot provides a living environment with a structured setting on an ongoing basis. It is three-pronged: a summer day camp, an activity program during the school year and a spring break camp. The course leader and group leaders create an environment which is conducive to the development of social and personal skills, introduces a dynamic that incorporates coaching and support, builds meaningful relationships and adapts to the changing needs of the young participants. Regular programming takes place after school, on weekdays. It is provided free of charge and the planning is done BY and FOR the kids. Social intervention through artistic and leisure activities is at the very heart

of the programming: artistic workshops and projects, help with homework, physical activities, community committee, community gardens, community meals, awareness-raising activities, parties, outings, etc. Many coordinated projects are added to the regular programming, based on special occasions and needs. (Ex.: free childcare during school professional activity days, two-day nature camp, "tableé des chefs" workshops, etc.) This year, our aim is to develop a gathering place to foster socialization among 12-to-18-year-olds, much like a youth centre, in the eastern part of Villeray, in partnership with two youth organizations, in keeping with the results of a previous consultation.

Organization: Groupe uni des éducateurs-naturalistes et professionnels en environnement (GUEPE) Project: Apprendre, c'est dans notre nature

A growing number of teachers are recognizing nature and "outside" as an effective environment in which to create learning opportunities. However, their resources to teach outdoors are pretty limited. In view of this, GUEPE offers activities near the school which provides a starting point for teachers interested in moving some of their teaching outside of school walls. Alongside a naturalist-educator, and with scientific equipment on hand, students produce a basic biodiversity inventory, which will help them put forward simple solutions for improving the surrounding environment. A follow-up in-class activity will also be created to further student learning and give teachers new project ideas. From the very start, students are at the heart of all activities: from the inventory to the solutions put forward to make their environment healthier, to improving biodiversity and getting their classmates interested in natural sciences. The project touches on many priority issues addressed in Vital Signs® of Greater Montréal 2017, offering children stimulating activities

and fostering their interest in science and educational success and in a healthy environment.

Organization: Projet Harmonie Project: Ensemble vers la réussite

Projet Harmonie fosters a welcoming community-integrated environment for residents of Habitations La Pépinière, a low-income housing complex in Montréal's Mercier-Ouest neighbourhood, to support them as they develop to their fullest potential. The Fonds Josée et Michel Jacques at the Foundation of Greater Montréal, alongside the FGM Community Initiatives Program, have lent their support to the "Ensemble vers la réussite" component of Projet Harmonie. This component is designed to promote the educational success of the neighbourhood's younger inhabitants by working on their self-esteem, developing their social engagement and fostering their parents' involvement. Donors have visited and met with the community, which has led to very interesting and rewarding conversations!

Organization: Joujouthèque Saint-Michel Inc. Project: Language stimulation, ages 2 to 5

“Language stimulation, ages 2 to 5” is one of the parent-child group activities offered by Joujouthèque Saint-Michel, putting children at the centre of their own development. The project will offer two activities to meet the various needs of its target clientele.

1- “Sourissimots”

- Language stimulation workshop for children aged three to five with little vocabulary and/or who don't finish their sentences
- Led by a community speech therapist and a teaching games counsellor
- Three semesters of five 90-minute workshops every two weeks / two groups of six parent-child dyads
- Educational booklets for each workshop, explained by the speech therapist and given to participants
- Experimentation with language stimulation games and strategies with the children
- Coaching and video feedback
- Game and book lending services so as to enable strategies to be pursued at home

2- “Livres O Max”

- Book-focused psychomotor game parent-child workshop (aged 2 to 4)
- Led by a family social worker
- three semesters of 10 two-hour weekly workshops /one group of 10 parent-child dyads
- Table of key words brought into play during the workshop
- Game and book lending

Reduced Inequalities

Reduce inequality within and among countries

Organizations: Native Women's Shelter of Montreal and Nazareth Community Project: Resilience Montreal

In the fall of 2019, following the OpenDoor organization's relocation, individuals experiencing homelessness living or socializing close to Cabot Square, on the west side of Montréal's downtown core, lost access to the basic and intervention services they needed. Seeing, as did other project partners, that a day centre close to the Square was absolutely necessary, FGM joined forces with other major foundations and institutional players in Montréal, including the City itself, to support the implementation of the Resilience Montréal center. This centre helps the area's vulnerable people, who often struggle with addiction and mental health problems. A significant proportion of these men and women are of aboriginal descent.

A partnership was therefore put in place, with the the Native Women's Shelter of Montreal and the Nazareth Community, so as to co-manage an establishment providing a day shelter with a high degree of acceptance, open seven days a week from 8 a.m. to 8 p.m. In its current form, the project, temporarily located in a vacant building on Sainte-Catherine Street, is a swift response to a pressing humanitarian crisis. That being said, a permanent solution is still needed given the ongoing precarious situation in the area.

Cirque Hors Piste, a social circus organization, created Cirkaskina, the National Social Circus Gathering, which allowed 150 young people aged 12 to 25 from 17 Canadian communities, including four Indigenous communities, to join forces in a collective project in January 2020. This historic three-day event was held in Montréal, the world capital of circus arts. Organizations using this art form as a vector of positive social change collaborated throughout the project's development. Cirkaskina's activities had an impact on the personal development of the young participants, helped develop their civic engagement and fostered a cultural exchange between Indigenous and non-Indigenous peoples. Young participants rounded off the event by giving a breathtaking performance at La Tohu for more than 700 spectators.

Organization: OnRoule.org

OnRoule is an organization with a mission to improve the well-being and increase the autonomy of people with reduced mobility or functional limitations by centralizing and circulating information on accessibility, educating the population and moving community stakeholders toward implementing innovative solutions.

Map all public locations by 2022

The #1000joursAH (Human Accessibility concept - HA) movement aims to map the current accessibility of all public locations by 2022 and make the information available to all citizens on the OnRoule.org platform. They will be able to discover a great number of new locations whose current accessibility (often partial) may suit their specific needs, even though it may not suit everyone's. This map will make a tangible difference in the lives of all citizens with mobility issues.

Sustainable Cities and Communities

Make cities inclusive, safe, resilient and sustainable

Project: RBC Future Launch Community Challenge Program

FGM offered its support to three projects as part of the RBC Future Launch Community Challenge, which offers tangible support to young people aged 15 to 29 from 150 small and mid-sized communities across Canada, to help them bring to life their own project designed to address their community's priority issues.

Lucas Hygate, a Baie-d'Urfé resident, is looking to use art to raise his community's awareness with respect to environmental issues. His project, TrashTalk, uses community cleanups as a starting point to the creation of sculptures which, in turn, will encourage the community to better protect its environment. His goal is ambitious: mobilize thousands of people and clean 1 million pounds of garbage in Greater Montréal.

Three young Kanésatake residents, namely Kawisaienhne Albany, Kassandra Bonspiel and Claudia Catafort-Clermont, will create, in collaboration with the Mohawk Language Custodian Association, a series of courses to teach members of the local community how to make traditional purses. The goal of this transmission of knowledge is to strengthen the community's identity and sense of cultural belonging as well as bolster the relationship among members involved in these classes who will cap off the project by taking part in an artisans' fair in 2020.

Kahnawake residents Brooke Splicer, Lily Deer and Cougar Kirby have created a project designed to preserve the Mohawk language and culture, Skátne lonkwawieientehaonhátie ("Learning together"). Their goal is to offer young community members with a safe space where they can learn more about the Kanien'kehá:ka language as well as its cultural practices through a series of workshops led by elders or traditional knowledge keepers. Topics discussed during these workshops will be chosen by the young participants themselves, so as to foster participation, in partnership with Kanien'kehá:ka Onkwawén:na Raotitíhkwa Language and Cultural Center. From a more general point of view, the project will foster inclusion, as well as strengthen the identity and sense of belonging of young members of the Kanien'kehá:ka community.

The RBC Future Launch Community Challenge, a national initiative that supports young leaders working to meet their communities' needs, is made possible thanks to the support of the RBC Foundation.

Promote just, peaceful and inclusive societies

Organization: Carrefour de ressources en interculturel Project: Rendez-vous interculturels

- **Call for projects, followed by their implementation, both in classrooms and community youth organizations:** Delivery of the project submission form; Presentation of the projects and project implementation.
- **Workshops to raise awareness:** "Myths and Realities in intercultural work" and two other workshop options for classrooms and community youth organizations: 100 children and young people are involved.
- **Implementation of the programming of the Rendez-vous interculturels event,** showcasing the many

disciplines worked on in class and in neighbourhood community organizations, in addition to artists from diverse backgrounds. More than 200 young participants are involved.

- **Rendez-vous interculturels are held (open to Pierre-Dupuy students during lunchtime and a "5 à 7" event open to the community):** This activity reaches over 180 high school students and 200 primary school students, as well as over 400 community members (parents) during the "5 à 7".



Arts and culture

Organization: Université de Montréal Project: La classe enchantée

The support of the Fonds Josée et Michel Jacques these past few years has helped support some 50 students from a school in the Côte-des-Neiges neighbourhood throughout the La classe enchantée program.

As was hoped for in this program's early days, the program has been maintaining the social relationship created within La classe enchantée, fostering the students' sense of belonging to their practice community. Thanks to this support, the youngsters were actively involved with La classe enchantée each Saturday, and were integrated in the orchestra as mentors, while receiving educational reinforcement. This model, proven to be successful by major programs such as El Sistema, produces in the young musicians a sense of belonging and pride which in turn positively impacts their social skills as well as their capacity to stay in school and educational success.

The Fund's support was crucial to the development of this exceptional program from its beginnings.

Report from the Audit Committee

From its very beginnings, the Foundation of Greater Montréal has committed to maintaining the highest standards both in terms of its financial management and its accountability. The Board ensures that sound governance practices pertaining to these issues are upheld through the Audit Committee.

The Audit Committee currently comprises five people, namely three Board members and two outside members.

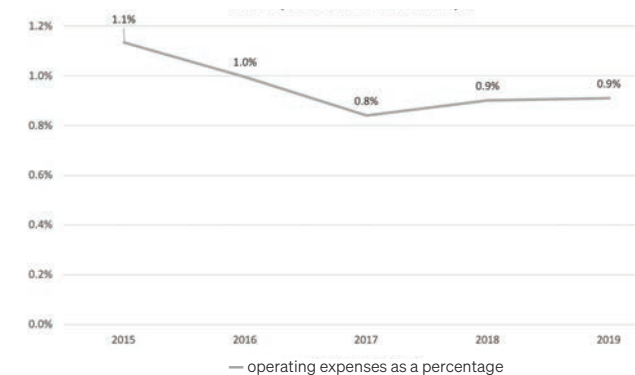
The Committee met five times in 2019 so as to monitor the quarterly and annual financial results of FGM and FGMIF (including the budget preparation process and periodic monitoring), and further various issues: IT security, performance indicators, reviewing the committee's mandate, assessment of the auditor, and reviewing the Board member expense reimbursement policy.

FGM posted excellent financial results in 2019, exceeding targets and generating an excess of revenue over expenses of \$25.5 million. Furthermore, given market developments and contributions received, FGM investments have grown from \$190.7 million to \$212.6 million during the period ending December 31, 2019. When factoring in investments managed on behalf of other organizations, FGM had \$345 million in managed funds as at December 31, 2019, an increase of almost \$37 million from the previous year. Thanks to donor confidence and contributions from government programs, total contributions to FGM reached close to \$27 million in 2019.

Committee Mandate

There is hereby established a committee of the Board of Directors called the Audit Committee which focuses primarily on financial information integrity, budget monitoring, internal and external auditing, financial statements, internal control mechanism implementation, risk management process, and material and information resources. It shall:

- approve the annual internal audit; assess and recommend to the Board the appointment of the auditors as well as approve their remuneration;
- ensure that internal control mechanisms are implemented and ensure that they are appropriate and effective;
- ensure that a risk management plan is implemented;
- review any activity which might affect the sound financial situation of FGM and which is brought to its attention by a leader;
- examine financial statements with the appointed auditor;
- recommend that the Board approve the financial statements;
- examine FGM budget estimates and submit them to the Board for approval;
- perform any other duty or function assigned by the Board.

Communications

FGM in the Media

The Foundation placed ads in several media, both in print and digital, to promote its activities to a wide audience. Among them were Le Devoir, The Gazette, Le Bel Âge, Mixte Magazine, Premières en affaires and Radio-Classique. FGM also benefited from being showcased in a variety of media through interviews and articles in La Presse, Novaé, MATv, Global Montreal and ICI Première.

Publications

FGM published two new reports this year, as part of the Zero Hunger in Montréal initiative. First off, in May, a portrait of the Montréal food security ecosystem (phase 2 of the project), was made public as part of the *Système Alimentaire Montréalais* (SAM) Forum, held at Dawson College. Then, in December, FGM unveiled its overview of phase 3 of the project, entitled *Pour un réseau d'approvisionnement de la sécurité alimentaire plus stratégique à Montréal*.

Events

On November 19, FGM held its seventh annual National Philanthropy Day celebration. A diverse panel reflected on and discussed the role of foundations as community actors in the twenty-first century. Afterwards, a networking cocktail brought together several representatives from the philanthropic and community sectors. Nearly 300 people attended the event.

Online Presence

In the fall, FGM entered into a partnership with an agency in order to meet several needs in the areas of communications and visibility, including a revamp of the FGM's website. Special attention was paid to digital media, with a new, more vibrant model being created for the Express FGM newsletter, and an increased presence on social media, including the creation of an Instagram page, which will be up and running in 2020.
